

Study Rooms Policy

The library has enclosed study rooms available for public use. These rooms are first-come, first-served for high school students, adults, or younger children who are accompanied by an adult.

Study Rooms are designed for use by one to four individuals at a time. Requesting users are required to show an ID and sign in at the Customer Service desk with their name and time. The room will be available for two hours – up to four hours if no one is waiting.

Patrons may utilize outlets to charge personal devices or checkout a laptop at the Adult Services desk. Food is not allowed in the study rooms but bottled water is acceptable.

- Persons using the study rooms are expected to engage in activities associated with the use of a public library and subject to the _____ Public Library's Patron Behavior policies.
- Study rooms are not intended to be the regular meeting site of any group or organization.
- Buying, selling, advertising, or trading products or services (other than educational services or a paid tutor) are prohibited.
