When you have completed the application and report(s), click on the email button in the upper right hand corner of each document and send them to Percap-grant@ilsos.net by **January 15, 2018**. Be sure to include your city in the subject line.

Here are a few helpful reminders when completing your FY18 Public Library Per Capita and Equalization application and FY16 expenditure report(s):

- Use only the latest version of Adobe Reader to complete the application and expenditure report forms. Macintosh and Windows versions of the free Adobe Reader are available from Adobe at <http://get.adobe.com/reader/>.
- To access the application, you will need your control and branch number. Note: Your branch number is 00.
- Save the application and expenditure report to your desktop, in Adobe Acrobat and work on it from there, saving frequently.
- Be sure to complete the application as per the requirements, including initials, date and correct population. Answer ALL questions; failure to do so constitutes an incomplete application!
- We DO NOT need your county clerk information.
- Report on FY16 funding only. The expenditure period runs from the time you received the FY16 award letter until June 30, 2017.
- The expenditure report(s) must be sent at the same time as the application. All are due by January 15, 2018.
- Your FY16 Per Capita/Equalization Amount must be exact.
- You do not need to list the dollar amount under each applicable category, just a short description to clarify the expenditure.
- Late/incomplete applications or scanned copies will not be accepted.

Release of Nexus LAB:OPEN Leadership Resources for libraries, archives, and museums

After many months of collaboration, Educopia Institute, the Center for Creative Leadership, TrueBearing, Toolkit Consulting and more than [35 library, archives and museum associations](#) have announced the launch of the [Nexus "Leading Across Boundaries" \(LAB\) resources](#). Funded by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), the Nexus LAB initiative brought together archivists, librarians and museum professionals to collaborate on leadership development. The Illinois State Library was proud to join collaborators from around the nation involved in the creation of these open leadership development resources that can be used by trainers and professionals spanning across these fields.

1. A [design framework](#) based on shared leadership challenges and competencies in libraries, archives and museums. The layers outline leadership competencies for six career stages, as well as related learning objectives and downstream outcomes derived from increased skill.
2. A [validated evaluation framework](#) that can be used by leadership trainers for any leadership program evaluation. These may be quickly customized for use in evaluating a broad range of existing and future leadership development programs.
3. A set of [fully-documented, open trainer materials](#) for seven leadership curriculum modules. These are flexible and customizable and include slides, detailed facilitator notes and activities.

The Nexus offerings are designed to be customizable to fit a wide variety of continuing education and professional development environments. Hosts and trainers are encouraged to freely adopt and adapt the materials to best fit their needs. Beginning each spring and concluding in the fall on [Family Reading Night](#), the program offers a new list of six titles written and/or illustrated by Illinois authors at six different age levels from birth to adult.

Secretary of State and State Librarian Jesse White is the honorary chair of the “Illinois Reads” Committee and encourages everyone to get involved by becoming an “Illinois Reads” [Ambassador](#), hosting or participating in a Family Reading Night program, attending an “Illinois Reads” author event and reading from the rich list of titles each year.

Each of the highlighted authors has published a book that has been selected to be on the 2017 “Illinois Reads” [book list](#) for adults.

[Jeremy McCarter](#) is an award-winning writer, director and producer in Chicago. He created, directed and produced the “Public Forum” series. His writing collaboration with Lin-Manuel Miranda created the #1 New York Times Bestseller, “[Hamilton: The Revolution](#).” The book is a wonderful testament to the eleven-time Tony Award-winning musical “Hamilton” and will be “a joy to anyone who loves the sound track or who has been lucky enough to score tickets to the show.”

Born in India, [Sonali Dev](#) now lives in Naperville. She is an award-winning author who started writing when she was eight years old. After earning a degree in architecture and written communication, she “migrated across the globe and started a family while writing for magazines and websites.” She now writes romance stories that highlight her Indian culture. Her second book, “[The Bollywood Bride](#),” has been called “A bright beautiful gem” and “Truly unforgettable.”

[Cristina Henriquez](#) resides in a western suburb of Chicago. She is the author of the award-winning novel, “[The Book of Unknown Americans](#).” Along with being named a New York Times Notable Book of 2014, one of Amazon’s Top 10 Books of the Year and a NPR Great Read – just to name a few, it was also long listed for the Andrew Carnegie Medal for Excellence in Fiction and a finalist for the Dayton Literary Peace Prize. The book has been described as “inspiring”, “powerful”, “brave”, “vivid” and “memorable.”

Literacy Spotlight

This month’s Literacy Spotlight highlights **McHenry County College** in Crystal Lake. A learner was brought to McHenry County College by her parents when she was 19 years old. After she had completed seventh grade in a local school, her parents decided to home school her. Staff at McHenry County College administered assessment tests and found that her reading was at a ninth grade level and her math was at a fifth grade level. The learner was shy and reluctant to speak to any staff or instructors. She proceeded to enroll in adult basic education (ABE) classes for reading and math but after one semester of classroom instruction her math scores declined. Staff suggested she enroll in the Adult Volunteer Literacy program and she began working with a math tutor. With the help of tutor, she achieved her High School Equivalency Certificate. The learner now displays self-confidence and no longer is as shy. The learner is now comfortable in a school atmosphere and plans to attend McHenry County College to begin her college education.
