# ATTORNEYS GENERAL

Under the Constitution of 1818, the Attorney General was appointed by the General Assembly. The 1848 Constitution mentioned the Attorney General only as an officer ineligible to be elected as a member of the General Assembly, and in view of the meager definition the office was held in abeyance until an act creating the office was approved Feb. 27, 1867, when Governor Oglesby appointed Ingersoll. Under the 1870 Constitution, the Attorney General became a constitutional officer.

# SECRETARIES OF STATE

Before the 1848 Constitution, the Secretary of State was appointed by the Governor rather than elected by the citizens of Illinois. Constitutionally, the Secretary is required to maintain acts of the General Assembly, specified records of the Executive Branch and the Great Seal of Illinois. Until 1973, responsibilities included supervising state elections. The administrative structure of the office and its diverse departments have undergone frequent change in an effort to fulfill statutory obligations.

# AUDITORS OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS

By mandate of the Illinois Constitution of 1818, the Office of the Auditor of Public Accounts assumed responsibility for auditing and recording all accounts of the state, keeping accounts of taxes that had been received or disbursed, and maintaining a fair record of the issuance of all warrants and certificates for disbursements. Initially, the Auditor of Public Accounts was appointed by the General Assembly for a four-year term; in 1833 the term was reduced to two years; and, under the 1848 Constitution, the office became a popularly elected one with elected officials serving four-year terms. The Office of the Auditor of Public Accounts was dissolved under the 1970 Constitution, and in 1973, the newly-created Comptroller became keeper of the state's fiscal accounts.

# TREASURERS

The 1818 Illinois Constitution designated that the Treasurer be appointed biennially by a joint vote of the General Assembly. In 1848, the Treasurer was popularly elected, and a 1959 constitutional provision changed the office term from two to four years. The Treasurer is empowered to receive proceeds of all taxes and make authorized disbursements from the state treasury.

## JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT

Under the Constitution of 1818, Justices of the Supreme Court were appointed by the General Assembly. Four justices were appointed in 1818, and five new seats were created in 1841. The Constitution of 1848 reduced the size of the court to three and provided for popular election of one justice from each of the state's three grand divisions. The Constitution of 1970 expanded the court to seven, its present size, while retaining popular election.

# CLERKS OF THE SUPREME COURT

Prior to adoption of Constitution of 1848, the Clerk of the Supreme Court was appointed by the court. The record as to dates of appointment is somewhat obscure. James M. Duncan was appointed July 12, 1819. Ebenezer Peck appears as the successor of Duncan; Wm. B. Warren seems to have been the successor of Peck. From 1848 to 1902, one clerk was elected in each of the Three Grand Divisions. The three were consolidated into one, comprising the entire state, by the Act of 1897, which provided that but one clerk be elected in 1902 and every six years thereafter. The 1970 Constitution provided that this office become appointive in 1975.

# TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS

The university was incorporated by act of the General Assembly, Feb. 28, 1867, as the Illinois Industrial University; its name was changed by the General Assembly in 1885 to the University of Illinois. Originally there were 28 trustees appointed by the Governor, who, with the president of the university, Dr. J. M. Gregory (called regent), the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the President of the State Board of Agriculture, were members ex officio. The original 28 appointed members drew lots at the first meeting to decide the length of their terms, as provided by law. The normal term is six years.

In 1873, the number of trustees was reduced to 11 — the Governor, President of the State Board of Agriculture and nine members appointed by the Governor for six-year terms. A number of trustees appointed to serve from March 1873 actually served only a few weeks, as the new law was effective in May 1873. In 1887, the General Assembly made membership on the board elective at a general state election and restored the Superintendent of Public Instruction as a member. The Office of President of the State Board of Agriculture was abolished by law, effective Jan. 1, 1919.

The following list gives the appointed members of the board from 1867 to March 12, 1889 (when the first elected trustees took office), followed by the names of the elected trustees to Jan. 1, 1996, when a new law once again made the positions appointive. However, based on a ruling of the Illinois Supreme Court on March 21, 1996, terms of elected trustees were allowed to expire, and future trustees are appointed by the Governor in groups of three every two years. The first three appointed trustees under this law took office in January 1997.
