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AGENCIES



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INTRODUCTION

The Illinois Register is the official state document for publishing public notice of rulemaking activity initiated by State governmental agencies. The table of contents is arranged categorically by rulemaking activity and alphabetically by agency within each category.

Rulemaking activity consists of proposed or adopted new rules; amendments to or repealers of existing rules; and rules promulgated by emergency or peremptory action. Executive Orders and Proclamations issued by the Governor; notices of public information required by State Statute; and activities (meeting agendas; Statements of Objection or Recommendation, etc.) of the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR), a legislative oversight committee which monitors the rulemaking activities of State Agencies; is also published in the Register.

The Register is a weekly update of the Illinois Administrative Code (a compilation of the rules adopted by State agencies). The most recent edition of the Code, along with the Register, comprise the most current accounting of State agencies' rulemakings.

The Illinois Register is the property of the State of Illinois, granted by the authority of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act [5 ILCS 100/1-1, et seq.].

Section 2800.240 Preparation and Submission of Travel Vouchers

All claims for the reimbursement of travel expenses shall be submitted on authorized reimbursement forms (Form C-10) and shall be itemized in accordance with this Part.

- a) The purpose of the travel shall be indicated on the travel vouchers.
- b) When applicable, the travel voucher shall show in the space provided the dates and times of travel, the points of departure and destination, the mode of transportation, the cost of the transportation secured, lodging, meals, per diem and other expenses.
- c) If meals or per diem are not claimed, times of arrival and departure are not required.
- d) When a privately owned vehicle is used, the travel voucher shall show, at minimum, commuting mileage (if applicable), the dates, points of travel and mileage. If the distance traveled between any given points is greater than the usual route between these points shown on a road map, the reason for the greater distance shall be explained and detailed separately.
- e) Travel vouchers shall be supported by receipts in all instances for railroad and airplane transportation, lodging, taxis, and all other items in excess, individually, of \$10.00 except for meals.
- f) The travel expense voucher shall be prepared ~~in ink or typewritten~~ in writing or electronically. ~~The~~ All copies of the voucher shall be signed ~~in ink~~ by the individual who has incurred the expense and his/her supervisor.

NOTICE OF ADOPTED RULES

Section 995.110 Purpose

The Capital Development Board design-build agreements shall be awarded only to design-build entities containing one or more firms prequalified with CDB under the A/E and/or contractor prequalification rules.

Section 995.120 Definitions

The following definitions shall apply to this Part:

"A/E Prequalification Rules" means 44 Ill. Adm. Code 980, the rules by which CDB prequalifies design professionals.

"CDB" means the Capital Development Board, the agency.

"Contract" or "Contract Requirements" consist of any and all provisions of the CDB Design-Build Contract.

"Contractor Prequalification Rules" means 44 Ill. Adm. Code 950, the rules by which CDB prequalifies firms as bidders on CDB construction projects.

"Design-Build" means a construction project delivery system that provides responsibility within a single contract for the furnishing of architecture, engineering, land surveying and related services as required, and the labor, materials, equipment and other construction services for the project.

"Design-Build Entity" or "DB" means any individual, sole proprietorship, firm, partnership, corporation, joint venture, or other legal entity that proposes to design and construct any public project under the Design-Build Procurement Act.

"Design Professional" means any individual, sole proprietorship, firm, partnership, corporation, or other legal entity that offers services under the Illinois Architecture Practice Act of 1989 [225 ILCS 305], the Professional Engineering Practice Act of 1989 [225 ILCS 325], the Structural Engineering Licensing Act of 1989 [225 ILCS 340], or the Illinois Professional Land Surveyor Act of 1989 [225 ILCS 330]. [30 ILCS 537/10]

"Prequalification" is the status granted by CDB to responsible A/E or contracting firms that permits them to make submittals on CDB projects or be awarded a CDB contract.

Section 995.130 Prequalification Required

DB entities desiring to enter into a DB contract with CDB must be prequalified with CDB under the A/E prequalification rules and/or the contractor prequalification rules prior to any submittal of qualifications or interest for a specific project and prior to entering a contractual relationship with CDB. For DB entities consisting of more than one independent firm (e.g., joint ventures or partnerships), each firm must be prequalified with CDB under the appropriate rule.

Section 995.150 Confidentiality

CDB may release to anyone the firm's prequalification status with CDB. However, neither the Performance Evaluations of the firm on a design-build project (DB PE) nor the DB's written responses to them shall be made available to any other person or firm, except as authorized by the Freedom of Information Act [5 ILCS 140/7(1)(b)(iii)].

SUBPART B: SUSPENSION, DEBARMENT, MODIFICATION OF PREQUALIFICATION, AND CONDITIONAL PREQUALIFICATION**Section 995.300 Responsibility and Prequalification**

At any time, CDB may consider whether an action is warranted concerning a firm's prequalification based on the rules under which that firm was prequalified with CDB (44 IAC 950 and 44 IAC 980). Actions that may be taken are those listed in the respective A/E and Contractor Prequalification Rules.

- a) Any action regarding suspension, debarment, modification of prequalification, or conditional prequalification of the DB entity or its design consultants or prequalified subcontractors will follow the rules under which that firm was prequalified with CDB.
- b) Any actions CDB takes with regard to suspension, debarment, modification of prequalification, or conditional prequalification of a firm in regard to its actions as a DB entity or as a design consultant or subcontractor to a DB entity may also apply to its prequalification to do other (non-DB) work with CDB, unless CDB

specifically restricts its action to apply to the entity's prequalification to participate in DB projects, in accordance with Section 995.400.

- c) CDB may consider that action regarding suspension, debarment, modification of prequalification, or conditional prequalification is warranted against any one or more than one or all of the firms in a DB entity, including design consultants or CDB prequalified subcontractors. Such action may be warranted when the DB entity prepares a specification or drawing containing an error or omission, or commits a breach of contract so that it causes the project to be completed significantly late or at a higher cost.
- d) Reasons for CDB to consider suspension, debarment, modification of prequalification, or conditional prequalification, in addition to those reasons set out in the respective A/E or Contractor Prequalification Rules, include a violation of the Illinois Procurement Code or failure to conform to the requirements of a design-build agreement, in accord with Section 50-65 of the Procurement Code.

SUBPART C: APPLICATION OF CDB ACTION

Section 995.400 General

Suspension, debarment, nullification of prequalification, modification of prequalification, issuance of conditional prequalification, or denial of prequalification by CDB is also applicable to a DB's separate prequalification as an A/E or contractor with CDB, unless the circumstances are directly related to the design-build process and not to the type of performance provided as an A/E or contractor. In such instances, CDB will issue a written determination supporting its action.

CDB will follow those procedures established in the rules under which the firm was prequalified (71 IAC 100).

Section 1030.100 Definitions

"Act" means the Design-Build Procurement Act [30 ILCS 537].

"Board" means the Capital Development Board.

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"CDB" means Capital Development Board, the agency.

"Design-Bid-Build" means the traditional delivery system used on public projects in this State that incorporates the Architectural, Engineering, and Land Surveying Qualification Based Selection Act [30 ILCS 535] and the principles of competitive selection in the Illinois Procurement Code [30 ILCS 500].

"Design-Build" or "DB" means a delivery system that provides responsibility within a single contract for the furnishing of architecture, engineering, land surveying and related services as required, and the labor, materials, equipment, and other construction services for the project.

"Design-Build Entity" or "DB Entity" means any individual, sole proprietorship, firm, partnership, joint venture, corporation, professional corporation, or other entity that proposes to design and construct any public project under the Act.

"Design Professional" or "A/E" means any individual, sole proprietorship, firm, partnership, corporation, or other legal entity that offers services under the Illinois Architecture Practice Act of 1989 [225 ILCS 305], the Professional Engineering Practice Act of 1989 [225 ILCS 325], the Structural Engineering Licensing Act of 1989 [225 ILCS 340], or the Illinois Professional Land Surveyor Act of 1989 [225 ILCS 330].

"Evaluation Criteria" means the requirements for the separate phases of the selection process as defined in the Act and may include the specialized experience, technical qualifications and competence, capacity to perform, past performance, experience with similar projects, assignment of personnel to the project, and other appropriate factors. Price may not be used as a factor in the evaluation of Phase 1 proposals.

"Scope and Performance Criteria" means the requirements for the public project, including, but not limited to, the intended usage, capacity, size, scope, quality and performance standards, life-cycle costs, and other programmatic criteria that are expressed in performance-oriented and quantifiable specifications and drawings that can be reasonably inferred and are suited to allow a DB entity to develop a proposal.

"User Agency" means the agency or unit of government for which the architectural/engineering firm is being selected.

Section 1030.110 Purpose

CDB shall procure DB services in compliance with the Act.

Section 1030.120 Written Determination

- a) Before electing to use DB on a given project, CDB shall make a written determination, including a description as to the particular advantages of the DB procurement method for that project. The following factors shall be considered and addressed in that statement:
 - 1) The probability that the DB procurement method will be in the best interests of the State by providing a material savings of time or cost over the design-bid-build or other delivery system.
 - 2) The type and size of the project and its suitability to the DB procurement method.
 - 3) The ability of CDB to define and provide comprehensive scope and performance criteria for the project.
 - 4) The best interests of the State will be served by entering into a DB contract for the project.
 - 5) The project will comply with the disadvantaged business and equal employment practices of the State as established in the Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females, and Persons with Disabilities Act [30 ILCS 575] and Section 2-105 of the Illinois Human Rights Act [775 ILCS 5/2-105].
- b) Within 15 days after the initial determination, CDB will provide an advisory copy of the written determination to the Procurement Policy Board, and shall maintain the full record of determination for 5 years.

Section 1030.130 Public Notice

- a) CDB shall issue a notice of intent to receive requests for proposals for a DB project at least 14 days before issuing the request for the proposal. A brief description of the proposed procurement shall be included in the notice.

- c) The agency may also publish the notice in related construction industry service publications.

Section 1030.140 Request for Proposal

- a) CDB shall provide a copy of the request for proposal to any party requesting a copy.
- b) An RFP shall be prepared by CDB for each project and will contain the following information:
 - 1) The Capital Development Board as the issuing agency;
 - 2) A preliminary schedule for the completion of the contract;
 - 3) The proposed budget for the project, the source of funds, and the currently available funds at the time the RFP is submitted;
 - 4) Prequalification criteria for DB entities wishing to submit proposals. The criteria shall include CDB's normal prequalification, licensing, registration, and other requirements and any additional criteria deemed necessary by CDB;
 - 5) Material requirements of the contract, including the proposed terms and conditions, required performance and payment bonds, insurance, the entity's plan to comply with the utilization goals for business enterprises established in the Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females, and Persons with Disabilities Act and with Section 2-105 of the Illinois Human Rights Act, and any other requirements deemed important by CDB;

NOTICE OF ADOPTED RULES

- 6) The scope and performance criteria:
 - A) Shall be in sufficient detail and contain adequate information to reasonably apprise the qualified DB entities of CDB's overall programmatic needs and goals, including criteria and preliminary design plans, general budget parameters, schedule, and delivery requirements;
 - B) Shall also include a description of the level of design to be provided in the proposals, including the scope and type of renderings, drawings, and specifications that will be required by CDB to be produced by the DB entities;
 - 7) The evaluation criteria for each phase of the solicitation, including relative importance or weighting factor of each item (see Sections 1030.170, Phase 1 Evaluation, and 1030.190, Phase 2 Evaluation);
 - 8) The number of entities (no fewer than 2 and no more than 6) that will be considered for the technical and cost evaluation phase (Phase 2);
 - 9) The submittal schedule:
 - A) For projects estimated to cost less than \$10 million, at least 21 days shall be allowed to prepare and submit Phase 1 proposals after the date of the issuance of the RFP.
 - B) For projects estimated to cost more than \$10 million, at least 28 days shall be allowed to prepare and submit Phase 1 proposals after the date of the issuance of the RFP.
 - C) For all projects, at least 30 days shall be allowed to prepare and submit Phase 2 proposals after the selection of entities from the Phase 1 evaluation is completed;
 - 10) Any other relevant information that CDB chooses to supply.
- c) The DB entity shall be entitled to rely upon the accuracy of information included in the request for proposal in the development of its proposal.

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Section 1030.150 Preparation of Scope and Performance Criteria

- a) The scope and performance criteria shall be prepared by a design professional who is an employee of CDB, or CDB may contract with an independent design professional selected under the Architectural, Engineering and Land Surveying Qualification Based Selection Act [30 ILCS 535] to provide these services.
- b) The design professional and/or officers of the design firm that prepares the scope and performance criteria are prohibited from participating in any DB entity proposal for the project.

Section 1030.160 Selection Committee

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- a) In Phase 1, CDB will evaluate and shortlist the DB entities based on qualifications submitted in response to the RFP.
- b) Evaluation shall be based on the prequalification requirements, evaluation criteria and relative importance or weighting of evaluation criteria as set forth in the RFP.
- c) Proposals shall not be reviewed until after the deadline for submission has passed.
- d) Proposals must meet all material requirements of the RFP or they may be rejected as non-responsive.
- e) CDB shall have the right to reject any and all proposals.
- f) CDB shall maintain a record of the evaluation scoring to be disclosed in event of a protest regarding the solicitation.
- g) Phase 1 evaluation criteria shall include:
 - 1) experience of personnel;
 - 2) successful experience with similar project types;
 - 3) financial capability in relation to the size of the project;
 - 4) timeliness of past performance;
 - 5) experience with similarly sized projects;
 - 6) successful reference checks of the firm;
 - 7) commitment to assign personnel for the duration of the project;
 - 8) qualifications of the entity's design consultants;
 - 9) CDB prequalification in good standing of any subcontractor proposed to perform any of the 5 subdivisions of work defined in Section 30-30 of the Illinois Procurement Code;

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- 10) Ability or past performance in meeting or exhausting good faith efforts to meet the utilization goals for business enterprises established in the Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females, and Persons with Disabilities Act and with Section 2-105 of the Illinois Human Rights Act;
- 11) Other relevant criteria deemed necessary by CDB.
- h) CDB will eliminate any DB entity from consideration for evaluation or award if the entity has any pecuniary interest in the project or has other relationships or circumstances, including, but not limited to, long-term leasehold, mutual performance, or development contracts with CDB, that may give the DB entity a financial or tangible advantage over other DB entities in the preparation, evaluation, or performance of the DB contract or that create the appearance of impropriety.
- i) CDB will not consider any proposal that does not include the entity's plan to comply with the requirements established in the Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females, and Persons with Disabilities Act and with Section 2-105 of the Illinois Human Rights Act .
- j) CDB will publish the names of all DB entities submitting Phase 1 proposals on CDB's website in the next Professional Services Bulletin after the deadline for submission.

Section 1030.180 Shortlist

- a) Upon completion of the Phase 1 qualifications evaluation, CDB shall create a shortlist of no fewer than 2 and no more than 6 (or the maximum number noted in the RFP) of the most highly qualified DB entities.
- b) At its discretion, CDB may create a shortlist of fewer than the maximum number allowed by the RFP.
- c) CDB shall notify in writing the entities selected for the shortlist.

- d) Proposals must meet all material requirements of the RFP or they may be rejected as non-responsive.
- e) CDB shall have the right to reject any and all proposals.
- f) CDB shall maintain a record of the evaluation scoring to be disclosed in event of a protest regarding the solicitation.
- g) CDB shall include the following criteria in the Phase 2 technical evaluation of DB entities:
 - 1) compliance with objectives of the project;
 - 2) compliance of proposed services to the RFP requirements;
 - 3) quality of products or materials proposed;
 - 4) quality of design parameters;
 - 5) design concepts;
 - 6) innovation in meeting the scope and performance criteria;

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- 7) constructability of the proposed project;
 - 8) other relevant criteria deemed necessary by CDB.
- h) CDB shall include the following criteria in every Phase 2 cost evaluation:
- 1) total project cost;
 - 2) construction costs;

 - 4) other relevant criteria deemed necessary by CDB;
 - 5) a total project cost criteria weighting factor of 25%.
- i) CDB shall directly employ or retain a licensed design professional to evaluate the technical and cost submissions to determine if the technical submissions are in accordance with generally accepted industry standards.

Section 1030.200 Submission of Proposals

- a) Proposals must be properly identified and sealed.
- b) Phase 1 proposals shall include a list of all design professionals and other entities as defined in Section 30-30 of the Illinois Procurement Code to which any work may be subcontracted during the performance of the contract.
- c) Phase 1 proposals shall include a list of all entities that will perform any of the 5 subdivisions of work defined in Section 30-30 of the Illinois Procurement Code.

- b) If the entity's performance in implementing the plan falls short of the performance measures and outcomes set forth in the plans submitted by the entity during the proposal process, CDB shall require a detailed written report, informing the General Assembly and the Governor whether and to what degree the DB entity promoted the utilization goals for business enterprises established in the Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females, and Persons with Disabilities Act and the provisions of Section 2-105 of the Illinois Human Rights Act.

Section 1030.250 Federal Requirements

CDB will comply with federal law and regulations and take all necessary steps to adapt the rules, policies, and procedures to remain eligible for federal aid.

The agreed-to, predetermined shift may include 'on call' but does not include other overtime staffing mechanisms in which a nurse employee's work, or availability to work additional hours, is at the sole discretion of the employer".

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2. In Section 250.1110(a), the proposed definition for "Call-back" was deleted from the adopted rulemaking.
3. In Section 250.1110(a), the definition for "On-call", which was proposed as "means nurses will be assigned specific, agreed-to, predetermined work shift hours of availability only if on-call is required to be a condition of employment or as a work obligation on a specific unit; and on-call hours are included in the agreed-to, predetermined work schedule. Additional hours of on-call in excess of the nurse's predetermined hours of work shall be strictly voluntary. The refusal of an employee to accept such on-call availability is not grounds for discrimination, dismissal, discharge, or any other penalty, threat of reports for discipline, or employment decisions adverse to the employee. On-call is not to be used to fill vacancies resulting from chronic, foreseeable staff shortages", was changed to "On-call/available' – the voluntary agreement by any nurse to be assigned specific agreed-to, predetermined hours of availability for work and a condition of employment." Additional hours of on-call in excess of the nurse's pre-determined hours of work shall be strictly voluntary".
4. In Section 250.1110(b), the new text "3) For any nurse who does not agree to employment requiring on-call hours, the refusal of a nurse employee to agree to such on-call availability shall not constitute grounds for retaliation, discrimination, dismissal, discharge, or any other penalty, threat of reports for discipline, or employment decisions adverse to the nurse employee." was inserted.
5. In Section 250.1110(b), the new text "4) The hospital's written staffing plan shall include an on-call policy for those units where on-call is required as a condition of employment." was inserted.
6. In Section 250.1110(b), the new text "5) On-call is not to be used to fill vacancies resulting from chronic or foreseeable staff shortages." was inserted.

The following changes were made in response to comments and suggestions of the JCAR:

1. In Section 250.1110(a), in the third line of the definition for "Agreed-to, predetermined shift", "pre-determined" was changed to "predetermined".
2. In Section 250.1110(a), in the second line of the definition for "On-call/available", "and" was changed to "as".

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3. In the same definition, one line lower, "pre-determined" was changed to "predetermined".

- 15) Summary and Purpose of the Rulemaking: The Hospital Licensing Requirements regulate hospital licensure. The adopted amendments added two new Sections to the rules.

Section 250.1110 (Mandatory Overtime Prohibition) implements Public Act 94-349, which prohibits mandatory overtime, with some exceptions called "unforeseen emergent circumstances". This Act prohibits hospitals from forcing nurses to work overtime without their consent. Hospitals also are prohibited from retaliating against nurses who refuse to work overtime.

Section 250.1120 (Staffing Levels) was added to ensure that hospitals have adequate staffing to meet the needs of patients and the requirements of P.A. 94-349.

SUBPART I: NURSING SERVICE AND ADMINISTRATION

Section 250.1110 Mandatory Overtime Prohibitiona) As used in this Section, the following definitions apply:

"Agreed-to, predetermined shift" – nursing hours of work, provided in advance to staff, in a prospective nurse staffing schedule for each patient care unit. Any work hours in addition to the predetermined shifts or prospective work schedule must be agreed to between the nurse employee and the employer. The agreed-to, predetermined shift may include "on call" but does not include other overtime staffing mechanisms in which a nurse employee's work, or availability to work additional hours, is at the sole discretion of the employer.

"Mandated overtime" – work that is required by the hospital in excess of an agreed-to, predetermined work shift. Time spent by nurses required to be available as a condition of employment in specialized units, such as surgical nursing services, shall not be counted or considered in calculating the amount of time worked for the purpose of applying the prohibition against mandated overtime. (Section 10.9(a) of the Act)

"Nurse" – any advanced practice nurse, registered professional nurse, or licensed practical nurse, as defined in the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing Act, who receives an hourly wage and has direct responsibility to oversee or carry out nursing care. For the purposes of this Section, "advanced practice nurse" does not include a certified registered nurse anesthetist who is primarily engaged in performing the duties of a nurse anesthetist. (Section 10.9(a) of the Act)

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"On-call/available" – the voluntary agreement by any nurse to be assigned specific agreed-to, predetermined hours of availability for work as a condition of employment. Additional hours of on-call in excess of the nurse's predetermined hours of work shall be strictly voluntary.

"Overtime" – the hours of work in excess of an agreed-to predetermined regularly scheduled shift, not to exceed 40 hours of work in a seven-day workweek.

"Retaliation" – disciplining, discharging, suspending, demoting, harassing, denying employment or promotion, laying off, or taking any adverse action against a nurse.

"Specialized unit" – a unit, such as surgical nursing services.

"Substantially affect" – affecting a situation, except for deviations that result in unimportant changes, given the particular situation involved.

"Unforeseen emergent circumstances" –

Any declared national, State or municipal disaster or other catastrophic event, or implementation of a hospital's disaster plan, that will substantially affect or increase the need for health care services; or

Any circumstances in which patient care needs require specialized nursing skills through the completion of a procedure.

An "unforeseen emergent circumstance" does not include situations in which the hospital fails to have enough nursing staff to meet the usual and reasonably predictable nursing needs of its patient. (Section 10.9(a) of the Act)

- b) Mandated overtime is prohibited. No nurse shall be required to work mandated overtime except in the case of an unforeseen emergent circumstance when such overtime is required only as a last resort.
- 1) Such mandated overtime shall not exceed 4 hours beyond an agreed-to, predetermined work shift. (Section 10.9(b) of the Act)

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- 2) Time spent by nurses required to be available as a condition of employment in specialized units, such as surgical nursing services, shall not be counted or considered in calculating the amount of time worked for the purpose of applying the prohibition against mandating overtime. (Section 10.9(a) of the Act)
 - 3) For any nurse who does not agree to employment requiring on-call hours, the refusal of a nurse employee to agree to such on-call availability shall not constitute grounds for retaliation, discrimination, dismissal, discharge, or any other penalty, threat of reports for discipline, or employment decisions adverse to the nurse employee.
 - 4) The hospital's written staffing plan shall include an on-call policy for those units where on-call is required as a condition of employment.
 - 5) On-call is not to be used to fill vacancies resulting from chronic or foreseeable staff shortages.
- c) When a nurse is mandated to work up to 12 consecutive hours, the nurse shall be allowed at least 8 consecutive hours of off-duty time immediately following the completion of a shift. (Section 10.9(c) of the Act)
- d) No hospital shall discipline, discharge, or take any other adverse employment action against a nurse solely because the nurse refused to work mandated overtime as prohibited under subsection (b) of this Section. (Section 10.9(d) of the Act)
- e) Violations
- 1) Any employee of a hospital that is subject to the Act and this Part may file a complaint with the Department of Public Health regarding an alleged violation of the Act. (Section 10.9(e) of the Act)
 - A) A complaint shall be submitted to the Department in writing, by telephone, or by personal visit.
 - B) An oral complaint will be reduced to writing by the Department.

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- 2) The complaint shall be filed within 45 days following the occurrence of the incident giving rise to the alleged violation. The Department will forward notification of the alleged violation to the hospital in question within 3 business days after the complaint is filed. (Section 10.9(e) of the Act)
- 3) Upon receiving a complaint of a violation of this Section, the Department may take any action authorized under Section 7 or 9 of the Act. (Section 10.9(e) of the Act)
- f) Any violation of this Section shall be proved by clear and convincing evidence that a nurse was required to work overtime against his or her will. The hospital may defeat the claim of a violation by presenting clear and convincing evidence that an unforeseen emergent circumstance, which required overtime work, existed at the time the employee was required or compelled to work. (Section 10.9(f) of the Act) Hearings shall be conducted in accordance with Section 250.140 of this Part.

Section 250.1120 Staffing Levels

- a) As used in this Section, the following definitions apply:
- "Nursing care" – care that falls within the scope of practice set forth in the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing Act or is otherwise encompassed within recognized professional standards of nursing practice, including assessment, nursing diagnosis, planning, intervention, evaluation, and patient advocacy. (Section 10 of the Hospital Report Card Act [210 ILCS 86])
- "Staffing levels" – the numerical nurse to patient ratio by licensed nurse classification within a nursing department or unit. (Section 10 of the Hospital Report Card Act)
- "Unit" – a functional division or area of a hospital in which nursing care is provided. (Section 10 of the Hospital Report Card Act)
- b) The number of registered professional nurses, licensed practical nurses, and other nursing personnel assigned to each patient care unit shall be consistent with the types of nursing care needed by the patients and the capabilities of the staff.

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Patients on each unit shall be evaluated near the end of each change of shift by criteria developed by the nursing service. There shall be staffing schedules reflecting actual nursing personnel required for the hospital and for each patient unit. Staffing patterns shall reflect consideration of nursing goals, standards of nursing practice, and the needs of the patients. (Section 15 of the Hospital Report Card Act)

- c) Current nursing staff schedules shall be available upon request at each patient care unit. Each schedule shall list the daily assigned nursing personnel and average daily census for the unit. The actual nurse staffing assignment roster for each patient care unit shall be available upon request at the patient care unit for the effective date of that roster. Upon the roster's expiration, the hospital shall retain the roster for 5 years from the date of its expiration. (Section 15 of the Hospital Report Card Act)
- d) All records required under this Section and Section 15 of the Hospital Report Card Act, including anticipated staffing schedules and the methods to determine and adjust staffing levels, shall be made available to the public upon request. (Section 15 of the Hospital Report Card Act)
- e) All records required under this Section and Section 15 of the Hospital Report Card Act shall be maintained by the facility for no less than 5 years. (Section 15 of the Hospital Report Card Act)
- f) A hospital covered by the Hospital Report Card Act shall not penalize, discriminate, or retaliate in any manner against an employee with respect to compensation or the terms, conditions, or privileges of employment who in good faith, individually or in conjunction with another person or persons, reports violations of the Hospital Licensing Act or the Hospital Report Card Act pursuant to Sections 35 and 40 of the Hospital Report Card Act. (Section 35 of the Hospital Report Card Act)

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Section 1030.APPENDIX B Acceptable Identification Documents

- a) An applicant applying for a driver's license or identification card for the first time in the State of Illinois must present one document from each of Group A, B, C, and D as outlined in subsection ~~(f)(4)~~ of this Section.
- b) A foreign national applying for a temporary visitor's driver's license shall submit one document from Groups A, B and D to prove name, date of birth, temporary residency, legal presence and verification of signature. Temporary visitor's driver's license applicants are not required to present documents verifying their social security numbers. Instead, they shall submit a letter on Social Security Administration letterhead, issued within 90 days prior to the date of application for a temporary visitor's driver's license, verifying ineligibility for a social security number. Acceptance of documents not listed in Groups A, B, and D below must be approved through the Division Administrator.
- c) An applicant applying for either a duplicate or corrected driver's license or identification card must present one form of identification from Group A, and at least one form from either Group B, C, or D as outlined in subsection ~~(f)(4)~~ of this Section. An applicant who requests a change in name, date of birth, social security number or gender must provide acceptable identification to create a link pertaining to the change between the previous information and the new information.
- d) A foreign national applying for a duplicate or corrected temporary visitor's driver's license shall submit one document from Groups A, B, and D to prove name, date of birth, temporary residency, legal presence and verification of signature. An applicant who requests a change in name, date of birth or gender must provide acceptable identification to create a link pertaining to the change between the previous information and the new information. Acceptance of documents not listed in Groups A, B, and D below must be approved through the Division Administrator.
- e) Applicants renewing their current Illinois driver's license or identification card need only present their current valid license or ID card. If they do not have their current driver's license or ID card, they must present one form of identification from Group A and at least one form from one of Group B, C, or D as outlined in subsection (f) of this Section.

- h) For a name change, the identification must be a document that provides a link to the established DL/ID file.
- i) Group B documents, as outlined in subsection ~~(f)(4)~~ of this Section, must contain the applicant's full name and date of birth and must be verifiable. To be verifiable, it must be possible to contact the regulatory authority to confirm the authenticity of the document. Birth certificate must be the original or certified by a Board of Health or Bureau of Vital Statistics within the US or by the US State Department, US Territories, or Canada. A certified copy is a document produced by the issuing jurisdiction that has an embossed seal or an original stamped impression. Foreign birth certificates are accepted as "proof" if accompanied with any other item listed in Group B.
- j) After review of all identification presented, management has the right to accept or refuse any document.

Section 1040.60 Release of Information Regarding a Disposition of Court Supervision

- a) For purposes of this Section, the following definitions shall apply:

"Driving Abstract" - a record kept by the Department of Driver Services on each driver licensed by the State of Illinois, containing all information required by Section 6-106(b) of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/6-106(b)], and all records of each driver's violations of the traffic laws, and administrative actions pertaining to driving privileges.

"Law Enforcement Officials" - police agencies, state's attorneys' offices or court officials.

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"Motor Carrier" - an operator of for-hire vehicles pursuant to Subchapter 4 (Illinois Motor Carriers of Property) of the Illinois Commercial Transportation Law of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/Ch. 18c, Subchapter 4].

"Request" – the written application upon the designated form, an approved electronic format, or an acceptable alternative for obtaining of a driving abstract and supervision history record.

"Supervision History Record" - a record kept by the Department of Driver Services on each person containing supervision disposition information provided in accordance with Section 6-204(da) of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/6-204(da)].

- b) Information pertaining to a driver's placement on court supervision for any offense as listed in Section 1040.20 of this Part shall not be released or made available to any source, except as expressly provided in subsection (c) of this Section.
- c) Information pertaining to a driver's placement on court supervision for any offense shall be released to law enforcement officials, the driver, ~~or~~ his/her attorney, or the driver's licensing administrator of any state upon receipt of the proper request. This information shall also be released to motor carriers or prospective motor carriers after notification to the driver or prospective driver. The Office of the Secretary of State shall provide sufficient information on the driver's driving abstract and supervision history record to enable the requesting party to obtain specific details of the matter by contacting the court that has previously granted the disposition of supervision.
