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INTRODUCTION

The Illinois Register is the official state document for publishing public notice of rulemaking activity initiated by State governmental agencies. The table of contents is arranged categorically by rulemaking activity and alphabetically by agency within each category.

Rulemaking activity consists of proposed or adopted new rules; amendments to or repealers of existing rules; and rules promulgated by emergency or preemptory action. Executive Orders and Proclamations issued by the Governor; notices of public information required by State Statute; and activities (meeting agendas; Statements of Objection or Recommendation, etc.) of the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR), a legislative oversight committee which monitors the rulemaking activities of State Agencies; is also published in the Register.

The Register is a weekly update of the Illinois Administrative Code (a compilation of the rules adopted by State agencies). The most recent edition of the Code, along with the Register, comprise the most current accounting of State agencies' rulemakings.

The Illinois Register is the property of the State of Illinois, granted by the authority of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act [5 ILCS 100/1-1, et seq.].

- 4) Statutory Authority: Implementing Section 4.08 of the Highway Advertising Control Act of 1971 [225 ILCS 440/4.08] and Section 2705-505 of the Civil Administrative Code [20 ILCS 2705/2705-505], and authorized by Section 4-201.1 of the Illinois Highway Code [605 ILCS 5/4-201.1] and Section 14 of the Highway Advertising Control Act of 1971 [225 ILCS 440/14.01]
- 5) A Complete Description of the Subjects and Issues Involved: This Part regulates the use of Tourist Oriented Directional Signs (TODS) displayed along various State-maintained non-freeways. It prescribes standards, specifications, and financial responsibility for the TODS program which provides motorists with travel-related directional information to facilities of interest to tourism. This program applies to non-freeways within the State of Illinois that are under the jurisdiction of the Department of Transportation (the Department) and that are outside of urban areas.

At Section 541.20, the Department is changing the definition of "Urban Area" by increasing the maximum population to 5,000 from 2,500. A review of the program over the last 10 years has shown that the population criteria can be raised to provide more opportunity for small tourist businesses to participate in the program.

At Section 541.60, the Department is deleting the provision concerning publication of a notice soliciting participation in the program since the program is fully operational and solicitation is no longer necessary. Additionally, a review of the program has shown that costs for installation and maintenance of the business signs have increased resulting in a need to amend the annual lease structure to ensure that the program pays for itself. Other amendments clarify the fee adjustment process.

At Section 541.Illustration A, the district map is being repealed and a list of district offices and counties is being added, at Section 541. Appendix A, to replace it.

Section 541.20 Definitions

The following words or phrases when used in this Part shall have the meanings ascribed to them below.

"Business" – an open establishment available to the general public thatwhich is oriented toward tourism and the major portion of whose income or visitors are derived during the normal business season from motorists not residing within 25 air miles of thesueh business.

"Business Sign" – a rectangular sign consisting of a business name, directional information, and mileage.

"Calendar Year" – a year beginning January 1 and ending the following December 31.

"Department" – the Illinois Department of Transportation, with central offices at 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois 62764.

"Intersecting Road" – a public road intersecting a marked State highway.

"Marked State Highway" – a State-maintained highway carrying a State or US route number.

"Non-Freeway" – a divided or undivided marked State highway without full control of access and without grade separations at crossroads.

"Qualifying Business" – a business meeting the criteria for signing contained in Section 541.40(f).

"Rural Area" – an area outside of an urban area.

"Tourist Oriented Directional Sign" or "TODS" – a rectangular sign installed on a State highway displaying the words "TOURIST ACTIVITIES" with a maximum of four business signs mounted underneath.

"Trailblazer Sign" – a business sign displayed, together with an arrow panel, off of a marked State highway to advise motorists where to turn on the intersecting road.

"Urban Area" – An urban area includes: one or more contiguous incorporated communities listed by the Federal Census Bureau ~~of Census~~ as encompassing a total population of 5,0002,500 or more within a defined area, including any unincorporated areas within such boundaries but excluding rural portions of "extended" communities; and Federal Census Bureau ~~of Census~~ designated places of 5,0002,500 or more population.

- a) Application

- ~~1)~~ ~~Where the TODS program is implemented on a State highway for the first time, the Department will publish in local newspapers a notice soliciting participation from eligible tourist oriented businesses.~~
- ~~1)2)~~ Application forms will be available from the Department (see Section ~~541. Appendix A – District Offices and Counties~~~~541. Illustration A – District Boundary Map~~ for a listing of District addresses and phone numbers) for all businesses that could qualify to have business signs included in this program. If a business wishes to participate in this program, it must complete an application form and submit it to the Department by the deadline indicated in the newspaper notice. Applications received after the indicated date will be considered if space is still available at the State highway intersection in question.
- ~~2)3)~~ Where the Department determines from the initial application that the business meets the criteria listed in this Part and space is available, the application will be approved and returned to the business along with instructions concerning payment of the annual fee.
- ~~3)4)~~ Applications for qualifying businesses desiring spaces subsequent to the initial installation will be considered on a first come-first served basis as spaces become available. Applications will be taken for spaces ~~that~~~~which~~ may become available at some future date when there are no spaces available at the time the applications are submitted. In such cases, the ~~processing~~~~application~~ fee will be returned to the applicant and the applicant's name will be kept on file. When a space becomes available, the qualifying businesses ~~that~~~~who~~ are on file will be notified by mail in the order of their initial application date to see if they are still interested in the space. The applicant who desires to have the available space and whose application has been on file the longest, providing the ~~processing~~~~application~~ fee is submitted within 45 days after the written notification, shall be given the available space with the remaining businesses being retained on file. Priority for two or more applicants with the same initial application date shall be based on the distance from the State highway with the business closest to the highway having the highest priority.

b) Fees

- 2) An annual fee of ~~\$70~~\$65, sufficient to offset the cost of this program, will be charged for each business sign displayed on the State highway system. This fee is based on recovering the Department's costs for the program based on a six year life for posts and signs and includes the placement of new signs as necessary. ~~The Every other calendar year, the~~ Department will ~~periodically adjust the fees to reflect the current cost of maintaining the signing system. Fee adjustments are subject to rulemaking~~ ~~recompute the fees and make such adjustments in this Section as may be warranted so as to reflect the cost of maintaining the signing system.~~ Fees will be collected on an annual basis. When a business establishment makes an annual payment, it will be guaranteed participation in the program for the entire year, as long as it continues to meet the criteria under this Part. Any business closing or withdrawing from the program after making its annual payment will not be given a refund. A prorated fee will be charged for signs initially installed after the beginning of a calendar year. No proration will be given for seasonal closings.
- 3) ~~When~~~~Where~~ payment is not received by the Department within 30 days after the due date, the business ~~signs~~sign(s) will be removed by the Department and the business will lose its signing priority to the next business desiring the space. When the fee is received after the business sign is removed, and space is still available on the panel, a fee of ~~\$100~~\$50 will be charged for ~~reprocessing~~reapplication as provided for in Section 541.60(b)(1), in addition to the annual fee for the remainder of the calendar year, as well as that portion of the annual fee owed for the period of time between the end of the preceding calendar year and the date the signs were removed.
- 4) A fee of ~~\$200~~\$150 for each business sign will be charged for a business requesting that its signs be replaced with new signs because of a change in the name of the business, or a change in the days or months of operation.

~~When~~~~Where~~~~such~~ replacement is requested, all business signs for the specific business on the State highway system will be replaced at the same time. Also, any business signs ~~that~~~~which~~ are tampered with by the business by altering the name, changing the days or months of operation, or ~~by~~ adding a logo, symbol or any other wording subsequent to their installation will be removed by the Department. If the business wishes to continue in the program, it shall pay a fee of ~~\$200~~~~\$150~~ per sign.

c) Placing and Maintaining Business Signs

- 1) The Department will erect the signs on the State highway system after approval of the application for a business and proof that trailblazer signs, where required, are in place on highways under the jurisdiction of local agencies. Only the Department will place, maintain, remove, or alter the business signs on the State highway system.
- 2) Businesses will be required to certify on the application that they meet the established criteria. When the Department receives a complaint that a business may not comply, the suspected business will be contacted by the Department to determine if it meets the established criteria. If it is determined the facility fails to qualify, the business must change its operation so as to comply or its business signs will be removed and no refund will be made of any portion of the annual fees already paid.



- b) Employees in Merit Compensation System/Broad-banded Titles
In the event no vacancies exist as described in Section 302.545, employees in merit compensation system/broad-banded titles shall be placed on the employing agency's reemployment list for the title and option from which the employee was laid off and any other titles in which the employee was previously certified within the county from which the employee was laid off and within two additional alternate counties designated by the employee. In the event the employee's facility or office is closing, the employee may designate one additional alternate county, for a total of four counties. In no event shall the vacancies include positions that are subject to collective bargaining unless those bargaining unit vacancies remain after all contractual obligations have been fulfilled. Laid off employees shall remain on the reemployment list for three years, commencing with the effective date of layoff. Reemployment of merit compensation system/broad-banded employees to positions under term appointments is subject to the provisions of Section 302.825. - c) Qualifications for Reemployment
An agency will not be required to consider any employee who does not have the necessary qualifications for reemployment to ~~any particular Senior Public Service Administrator or Public Service Administrator~~ position, or who was not at the same or higher organizational level as the position being filled. If an agency makes such a determination, this must be documented and submitted to the Department of Central Management Services.
- d) Reinstatement
An employee whose name has been placed on the reemployment list will also be eligible for reinstatement in accordance with Section 302.610.

SUBPART A: GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 140.2 Medical Assistance Programs

- a) Under the Medical Assistance Programs, the Department pays participating

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providers for necessary medical services, specified in Section 140.3 through 140.7 for:

- 1) persons eligible for financial assistance under the Aid to the Aged, Blind or Disabled-State Supplemental Payment (AABD-SSP) and Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) programs (Medicaid-MAG);
- 2) persons who would be eligible for financial assistance but who have resources in excess of the Department's eligibility standards and who have incurred medical expenses greater than the difference between their income and the Department's standards (Medicaid-MANG);
- 3) persons receiving financial assistance under the General Assistance (GA) program, either State Transitional Assistance or State Family and Children Assistance (GA-Medical);
- 4) individuals under age 18 who do not qualify for TANF/TANF-MANG and infants under age one year (see Section 140.7);
- 5) pregnant women who would not be eligible for TANF/TANF-MANG if the child were born and who do not qualify as mandatory categorically needy (see Section 140.9);
- 6) persons who are eligible for Title IV-E adoption assistance/foster care assistance from another State and who are living in Illinois;
- 7) noncitizens who have an emergency medical condition (see 89 Ill. Adm. Code 120.310); however, payment is not included for care and services related to an organ transplant procedure; ~~and~~
- 8) persons eligible for medical assistance under the Aid to the Aged, Blind or Disabled (AABD) program who reside in specified Supportive Living Facilities (SLFs), as described at 89 Ill. Adm. Code 146, Subpart B; ~~and-~~
- 9) persons eligible for FamilyCare as described in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 120.32 and 120.34 and 89 Ill. Adm. Code 118.600, Subpart F.

- b) "Necessary medical care" is that which is generally recognized as standard medical care required because of disease, disability, infirmity or impairment.

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- c) The Department may impose prior approval requirements, as specified by rule, to determine whether the medical care is necessary and eligible for payment from the Department in individual situations. Such requirements shall be based on recommendations of technical and professional staff and advisory committees.
- d) When recipients are entitled to Medicare benefits, the Department shall assume responsibility for their deductible and coinsurance obligations, unless the recipients have income and/or resources available to meet these needs. The total payment to a provider from both Medicare and the Department shall not exceed either the amount that Medicare determines to be a reasonable charge or the Department standard for the services provided, whichever is applicable.
- e) The Department shall pay for services and items not allowed by Medicare only if they are provided in accordance with Department policy for recipients not entitled to Medicare benefits.
- f) The Department may contract with qualified practitioners, hospitals and all other dispensers of medical services for the provision and reimbursement of any and all medical care or services as specified in the contract on a prepaid capitation basis (i.e., payment of a fixed amount per enrollee made in advance of the service); volume purchase basis (i.e., purchase of a volume of goods or services for a price specified in the contract); ambulatory visit basis (i.e., one comprehensive payment for each visit regardless of the services provided during that visit) or per discharge basis (i.e., one comprehensive payment per discharge regardless of the services provided during the stay). Such contracts shall be based either on formally solicited competitive bid proposals or individually negotiated rates with providers willing to enter into special contractual arrangements with the State.
- g) The Department may require that recipients of medical assistance under any of the Department's programs exercise their freedom of choice by choosing to receive medical care under the traditional fee for service system or through a prepaid capitation plan or under one of the other alternative contractual arrangements described in subsection (f) of this Section. The categories of recipients who may choose or be assigned to an alternative plan will be specified in the contract. Recipients required to make such a choice will be notified in writing by the Department. If a recipient does not choose to exercise his/her freedom of choice, the Department may assign that recipient to a prepaid plan. Under such a plan, recipients would obtain certain medical services or supplies from a single source

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or limited source. The Department will notify recipients in writing if they are assigned to a prepaid plan. Recipients enrolled in or assigned to a prepaid plan will receive written notification advising them of the services which they will receive from the plan. Covered services not provided by the plan will be reimbursed by the Department on a fee for service basis. Recipients will receive a medical eligibility card, which will apply to such services.

- h) The Department may enter into contracts for the provision of medical care on a prepaid capitation basis from a Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) whereby the recipient who chooses to receive medical care through an HMO must stay in the HMO for a certain period of time, not to exceed six months (the enrollment period). Upon written notice, the recipient may choose to disenroll from such an HMO at any time within the first month of each enrollment period. The Department will send the recipient a notice at least 30 days prior to the end of the enrollment period, which gives the recipient a specified period of time in which to inform the Department if the recipient does not wish to re-enroll in the HMO for a new enrollment period. The recipient may then disenroll at the end of the enrollment period only if the recipient responds to the notice and indicates in writing a choice to disenroll. Failure to respond to the notice will result in automatic re-enrollment for a new enrollment period. Recipients shall also be allowed to disenroll at any time for cause.
- i) The Department may enter into contracts for the provision of medical care on a prepaid capitation basis from a Health Maintenance Organization whereby the recipient who chooses to receive medical care through an HMO may choose to disenroll at any time, upon written notice.
- j) The Department shall pay for services under the Maternal and Child Health Program, a primary health care program for pregnant women and children (see Subpart G).

- a) Payment for podiatry services shall be made only to licensed podiatrists.

- 1) Essential for the diagnosis and treatment of conditions of the feet.
 - 2) Listed in the ~~Current~~ Common Procedural Terminology (CPT) for podiatric office visits, diagnostic radiology, pathology, or orthomechanical procedures included in the Department's schedule of podiatric services.
 - 3) Performed by the podiatrist or under the direct supervision of the podiatrist.

2009-325**GUBERNATORIAL PROCLAMATION**

On October 24, 2009, the President of the United States declared a national emergency pursuant to section 201 of the National Emergencies Act to facilitate the country's ability to respond to the H1N1 influenza virus. The H1N1 epidemic is moving rapidly and, as with the rest of the country, it is necessary for the State of Illinois to be ready to combat and prevent the spread of the virus. The State has begun receiving shipments of the H1N1 influenza vaccine and hospitals and medical clinics are treating an increasing amount of cases of the H1N1 influenza virus.

Therefore, in the interest of aiding the citizens of Illinois, medical facilities, and the State agencies and local governments responsible for ensuring public health and safety, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 7 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3305/7, I hereby proclaim that a public health emergency exists in the State of Illinois.

This gubernatorial proclamation will assist the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and the Illinois Department of Public Health in coordinating State efforts in accordance with the State emergency response plans. This proclamation will allow for modification of scopes of practice for occupations with training to give vaccinations as well as assist with patient treatment.
