## INTRODUCTION

The Illinois Register is the official state document for publishing public notice of rulemaking activity initiated by State governmental agencies. - 4) Statutory Authority: Implementing Article XXVI and Article XL of the Illinois Insurance Code [215 ILCS 5/Arts. XXVI and XL], and Title V of the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (GLBA), (15 USC 6801 through 6827) and authorized by Section 401 and Article XL of the Illinois Insurance Code [215 ILCS 5/401 and Art. XL].
- 5) A Complete Description of the Subjects and Issues Involved: In the past several years both the federal government and regulators have given much attention to the idea that protecting personally identifiable information is a fundamental right of US citizens, hence the passage of what is now known as the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act. While the Department took appropriate action promulgating Part 4001 in July of 2000 to formalize a compliance date for the insurance industry, and followed-up one year later promulgating Part 4002 setting specific standards for the insurance industry to follow in order to protect consumers, the national discussion to better identify and further refine standards to protect the privacy of individuals remains ongoing.  
  
During the past year the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) adopted a model regulation that will further safeguard the protection of consumer information which the insurance industry comes into possession of and maintains on a routine basis. The Department is now adopting these standards within our State by promulgating this new regulation under the general federal regulatory framework of Title V of the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act.

**Section 4003.10 Purpose**

The purpose of this Part is to establish standards for developing and implementing administrative, technical and physical safeguards to protect the security, confidentiality and integrity of customer information pursuant to Sections 501, 505(b) and 507 of the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (15 USC 6801, 6805(b) and 6807).

**Section 4003.20 Applicability**

This Part applies to all licensees, companies, and other persons licensed or required to be licensed, or authorized or required to be authorized, or registered or required to be registered, or domiciled pursuant to the Illinois Insurance Code or any other Act of Chapter 215 of the Illinois

Compiled Statutes. This Part also applies to unauthorized insurers or companies who accept business placed through a licensed surplus line producer in this State, but only in regard to the surplus line transactions placed pursuant to Section 445 of the Illinois Insurance Code [215 ILCS 5/445]. However, this Part does not apply to "service contract providers" as defined by the Service Contract Act [215 ILCS 152].

**Section 4003.30 Definitions**

Code means the Illinois Insurance Code [215 ILCS 5].

Customer means a customer of the licensee as the term customer is defined in 50 Ill. Adm. Code 4002.30 or in any of the Acts in Chapter 215 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes.

Customer Information means nonpublic personal financial information as defined in Section 50 Ill. Adm. Code 4002.30 or in any of the Acts in Chapter 215 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes about a customer, whether in paper, electronic or other form, that is maintained by or on behalf of the licensee.

Customer Information Systems means the electronic or physical methods used to access, collect, store, use, transmit, protect or dispose of customer information.

Department means the Illinois Department of Insurance.

Director means the Director of the Illinois Department of Insurance.

Licensee means a licensee as that term is defined in Section 50 Ill. Adm. Code 4002.30 or in any of the Acts in Chapter 215 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes. Licensee shall also include unauthorized insurers who accept business placed through a licensed surplus line producer in this State, but only in regard to the surplus line placements placed pursuant to Section 445 of the Illinois Insurance Code [215 ILCS 5/445].

Service Provider means a person that maintains, processes or otherwise is permitted access to customer information through its provision of services directly to the licensee.

**Section 4003.40 Information Security Program**

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULES

Each licensee shall implement a comprehensive written information security program that includes administrative, technical and physical safeguards for the protection of customer information. The administrative, technical and physical safeguards included in the information security program shall be appropriate to the size and complexity of the licensee and the nature and scope of its activities.

**Section 4003.50 Objectives of Information Security Program**

A licensee's information security program shall be designed to:

- a) Ensure the security and confidentiality of customer information;
- b) Protect against any anticipated threats or hazards to the security or integrity of the information; and
- c) Protect against unauthorized access to or use of the information that could result in substantial harm or inconvenience to any customer.

**Section 4003.60 Examples of Methods of Development and Implementation**

The actions and procedures described in Sections 4003.70 through 4003.100 of this Part are examples of methods of implementation of the requirements of Sections 4003.40 and 4003.50 of this Part. These examples are non-exclusive illustrations of actions and procedures that licensees may follow to implement Sections 4003.40 and 4003.50.

**Section 4003.70 Assess Risk**

The licensee:

- a) Identifies reasonably foreseeable internal or external threats that could result in unauthorized disclosure, misuse, alteration or destruction of customer information or customer information systems;
- b) Assesses the likelihood and potential damage of these threats, taking into consideration the sensitivity of customer information; and
- c) Assesses the sufficiency of policies, procedures, customer information systems and other safeguards in place to control risks.

**Section 4003.80 Manage and Control Risk**

The licensee:

- a) Designs its information security program to control the identified risks, commensurate with the sensitivity of the information, as well as the complexity and scope of the licensee's activities;

- b) Trains staff, as appropriate, to implement the licensee's information security program; and
- c) Regularly tests or otherwise regularly monitors the key controls, systems and procedures of the information security program. The frequency and nature of these tests or other monitoring practices are determined by the licensee's risk assessment.

**Section 4003.90 Oversee Service Provider Arrangements**

The licensee:

- a) Exercises appropriate due diligence in selecting its service providers; and
- b) Requires its service providers to implement appropriate measures designed to meet the objectives of this Part, and, where indicated by the licensee's risk assessment, takes appropriate steps to confirm that its service providers have satisfied these obligations.

**Section 4003.100 Adjust the Program**

The licensee monitors, evaluates and adjusts, as appropriate, the information security program in light of any relevant changes in technology, the sensitivity of its customer information, internal or external threats to information, and the licensee's own changing business arrangements, such as mergers and acquisitions, alliances and joint ventures, outsourcing arrangements and changes to customer information systems.

**Section 4003.110 Penalties**

Failure to meet the requirements of this Part shall subject the licensee to penalty provisions of Section 403A of the Illinois Insurance Code [215 ILCS 5/403A].

Licensed trappers in possession of valid Firearm Owners Identification may use .22 rimfire rifles

to kill trapped raccoon, opossum, striped skunk, red fox, gray fox, coyote and woodchuck (groundhog) during seasons established by Section 570.20, including portions of such open seasons that coincide with hunting seasons for taking white-tailed deer by use of firearms (17 Ill. Adm. Code 650.10), muzzleloading rifles (17 Ill. Adm. Code 660.10) and handguns (17 Ill. Adm. Code 680.10). Use of any other rifle firearm to kill trapped raccoon, opossum, striped skunk, red or gray fox, coyote or woodchuck during gun deer seasons is a Class B misdemeanor (see 520 ILCS 5/2.30).

- 5) Complete Description of the Subjects and Issues Involved: These proposed amendments concerning supportive living facilities (SLFs) are intended to hold facility rates at the levels in effect on September 30, 2002. SLFs provide living arrangements which are alternatives to traditional nursing facility (NF) care for younger adults with a disability and persons who are 65 years of age and over who meet certain requirements. The SLF project began in 1998 and currently, there are 15 operational SLFs in Illinois which provide residential services for approximately 370 Medicaid residents. Rates paid for SLF services are set at 60 percent of the weighted average NF rate, based upon the geographic group in which it is located. The rates are reviewed annually and necessary adjustments are effective on October 1.

On July 1, 2002, NF rates experienced a 5.9 percent decrease. The Department has determined that this NF rate decrease should not impact upon SLFs and is therefore proposing these changes to hold SLF rates at the pre-October 1 levels.

An additional change is being made to strike a reference to contracts because the Department is no longer under contract with any operational, approved or pending SLF.

The proposed rulemaking will not result in any budgetary changes.

- 4) Statutory Authority: 35 ILCS 630/17
- 5) A Complete Description of the Subjects and Issues Involved: These regulations amend Section 495.100 to explain the taxation of charges for private lines under the Telecommunications Excise Tax Act ("Act"). The amendments explain that under the Act, there are three methods that can be used to determine what portion of the total charge for a private line is subject to tax. The third method under the Act is to tax "charges for that portion of the interstate inter-office channel provided within Illinois." The regulation is intended to provide guidance regarding acceptable methods of calculating the Illinois portion of an interstate inter-office channel. The regulation discusses several specific methods that could be used to calculate the portion of the interstate inter-office channel that is provided within Illinois. The ideal method, it states, is to determine a fraction, the numerator of which is the actual measured Illinois miles of a channel and the denominator of which is the actual measured route miles of the entire channel. In situations in which it is impossible for a telecommunications provider to measure actual route miles, the regulation states that accurate approximations can be used. One method of approximation, the regulation states, is to use straight-line air miles. Additionally, the regulation specifies that the use of a percentage to determine the Illinois portion of the interstate inter-office channel is appropriate if the telecommunications provider can demonstrate that the percentage used is a reasonable approximation of the Illinois portion of the channel. The regulation provides that a method of approximation will be accepted by the Department unless the Department demonstrates that the method distorts the Illinois portion of the interstate inter-office channel by more than 10 percent. A telecommunication provider's reliance upon this tolerance is conditioned upon its maintenance of complete books and records and provision of those records to the Department upon request.

**Section 495.100 Meaning of "Gross Charges"**

- a) *"Gross ~~charge~~ Charge" means the amount paid for the act or privilege of originating or receiving telecommunications in this State and for all services and equipment provided in connection therewith by a retailer, valued in money, whether paid in money or otherwise, including cash, credits, services and property of every kind or nature, and shall be determined without any deduction on account of the cost of such telecommunications, the cost of materials used, labor or service cost or any other expense whatsoever. (Section 2(a) of the Telecommunications Excise Tax Act (the Act) [35 ILCS 630/2(a)]: A retailer may provide services to customers ~~that which~~ are not provided in connection with originating or receiving telecommunications. If such services are not necessary for or directly related to the retailer's provision of telecommunications to customers and the charges for such services are disaggregated and separately*

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- identified from other charges, the charges need not be included in "Gross ~~charges~~ Charges". Without limitation, examples of such services not included in "Gross ~~charges~~ Charges" are directory advertising; specialized designing and/or engineering services; specialized security measures; and consulting services.
- b) *Gross ~~charges~~ Charges shall not include charges for customer equipment, including such equipment that is leased or rented by the customer from any source, wherein such charges are disaggregated and separately identified from other charges (Section 2(a)(4) of the Act). Customer equipment includes, but is not limited to, all items generally classified as customer equipment or terminal equipment, such as telephone instruments and station sets, dialers, modems, private branch exchanges (PBXs), inside wiring, facsimile machines, pagers and non-electronic associated items such as documentation, manuals and furniture. Such items of customer equipment, including maintenance and miscellaneous services, may be leased, rented or sold to one customer or a group of customers without being included in the gross charges, but will be subject to Retailers' Occupation or Use Taxes. To be exempt, the charges for customer equipment must be disaggregated and separately identified from other charges in the books and records of the retailer.*
- c) *Gross charges does not include charges for the storage of data or information for subsequent retrieval or charges for the processing of data or information intended to change its form or content (Section 2(a)(3) of the Act). Charges for answering services, for example, whether provided electronically or by live operators, represent charges for the storage of information or data for subsequent retrieval, and are not subject to tax, provided that these charges, if provided in connection with taxable telecommunications, are disaggregated and separately identified in the books and records of the retailer. Charges for automated data storage, retrieval and processing services or for the use of computer time or other equipment are not included in gross charges. Automated information retrieval or data processing charges are not included in gross charges. For example, a customer who accesses an on-line computer data base would not be subject to tax on the charge for the data processing or inquiry, but would be subject to tax on the charge for the transmission of the data. If a telecommunications retailer provides both transmission and data processing services, the charges for each must be disaggregated and separately identified in the books and records of the retailer.*
- d) *Value added services in which computer processing applications are used to act on the form, content, code and protocol of the information for purposes other than transmission are exempt (Section 2(c) of the Act). For example, the charges for computer data, protocol conversions ~~that which~~ permit computers to exchange data, no matter which languages or protocols a computer's out-put may be in, and packet-switching, which groups data into packets for efficiency of transmission,*

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would be exempt.

- e) Advertising revenue either from directory sales (yellow pages) or from message additions to telecommunications service are not included in gross charges. For example, revenues from an advertising message preceding a time/weather call are not included in gross charges.
- f) Contributions to a telethon fund-raising campaign are not included in gross charges.
- g) Gross charges shall include, but are not limited to, charges for unlisted or unpublished numbers, operator assistance, directory information, call-waiting, call-forwarding, and burglar alarm services provided by telecommunications retailers.
- h) A caller located in Illinois who calls a 900 number and receives a billing for that call at his service address, will have made a call subject to Telecommunications Excise Tax. The invoice to the caller for a 900 number call need not separately state the line charge and tax thereon specifically. However, the telecommunications retailer is responsible for remitting the tax due on the line charge.
- i) Gross charges shall include the transmission charges for premium services. Time/weather, gab line/party line and other public announcement services of information and entertainment, and charges for the message content or information of such services, are not included in gross charges.

Example: A call to a 900 code number is made to register an opinion in a poll. The caller is billed \$1.00. \$.80 is the transmission charge. \$.80 is included in gross charges.

- j) Charges for billing and collection received by telecommunications retailers from persons selling services or products to the telecommunications retailer's customers, which are billed and collected by the telecommunications retailer, are not included in gross charges.

Example: A call to a 900 code number to sell a product is billed by the telecommunications retailer as follows:

\$25.00	service charge to caller for product or service
\$. 30	call charge (15¢ call, 15¢ billing and collection)
\$ .15	billing and collection charge is not included in gross charges

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\$25.00 is not included in gross charges

\$ .15 is included in gross charge

- k) Billing and collections charges paid by persons selling services or products to telecommunications retailer's customers or billing and collections charges paid by telecommunications retailers to credit card companies whose holders have charged calls are not includable in gross charges.
- l) Taxes imposed on consumers for community 911 service, ~~lifeline~~ ~~life-line~~ service or other services required by regulatory authorities or government are not includable in gross charges.
- m) Generally, persons that provide customers access to the Internet ("Internet Service Providers" or "ISPs") and who do not, as part of that service, charge customers for the line or other transmission charges that are used to obtain access to the ISP's server or other point of access, are not considered to be telecommunications retailers from these activities. This is the case so long as such ISPs do not, as part of their billing, charge customers for such line charges and instead pay their telecommunications suppliers all transmission costs that they incur in providing the Internet service. In this situation, an ISP's customer pays his telecommunications supplier for all transmission costs incurred while using the service. The single monthly fee charged by the ISP, which often represents a flat charge for a package of items including Internet access, e-mail, and electronic newsletters, would generally not be subject to tax. If, however, the ISP charges customers for line or other transmission charges, it should provide its telecommunications suppliers with Certificates of Resale and should collect and remit the tax. For example, if an ISP provides customers with Internet access, as described ~~in this subsection above~~, but also provides customers the use of a 1-800 service to access the ISP, and separately assesses customers per minute charges for the use of the 1-800 service, the ISP is considered a telecommunications retailer and incurs Telecommunications Excise Tax on the charges made for the 1-800 service. If the charges are not disaggregated as provided in subsection (c) ~~above~~, all charges are subject to the Telecommunications Excise Tax.
- n) *"Gross charges" for private line service shall include:*
- 1) *charges imposed at each channel point within this State;*
  - 2) *charges for the channel mileage between each channel point within this State; and*
  - 3) *charges for that portion of the interstate inter-office channel provided within Illinois. (Section 2(a) of the Act)*

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- A) Gross charges for private line service include only charges for the Illinois portion of the interstate inter-office channel provided within Illinois. No charge for any portion of an interstate inter-office channel that is outside Illinois is to be included in gross charges for determining Illinois telecommunications excise tax.
- B) When determining what portion of the interstate inter-office channel is provided within Illinois, the determination must be based on mileage. That is, the Illinois mileage of the channel must be compared to the mileage of the entire channel.
- C) The ideal method to calculate the Illinois portion of an interstate inter-office channel would be to determine a fraction, the numerator of which is the actual measured Illinois miles of that channel and the denominator of which is the actual measured route miles of the entire channel.
- D) However, where it is impossible for a telecommunications provider to measure actual route miles, that telecommunications provider can approximate the Illinois route miles of the channel and the route miles of the entire channel. Any method that accurately approximates the Illinois route miles of an interstate inter-office channel and accurately approximates the route miles of the entire channel can be used so long as the method of approximation does not distort the Illinois portion of the interstate inter-office channel by more than 10 percent (see subsection (n)(3)(G) of this Section).
- E) One method of approximation is the use of straight-line air miles. To use this method of approximation, straight-line air miles between the cities involved in the interstate inter-office channel would be determined from a standard air miles chart. Then, in order to establish the Illinois portion of the channel, the air miles on the straight line from the Illinois city of the inter-office channel to the Illinois border would be used as the numerator of the fraction and the straight-line air miles between the Illinois city and the out-of-state city involved in the inter-office channel would be used as the denominator of the fraction. For purposes of this method, the term "cities" includes a particular city and its metropolitan area. For cities with multiple airports, the location of the commercial airport closest to the endpoint of the private line should be used.
- F) The use of a flat percentage to approximate the Illinois portion of an interstate inter-office channel is not appropriate if the percentage is not a reasonable approximation of the Illinois portion

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of the channel. However, the use of a percentage to determine the Illinois portion of the interstate inter-office channel is appropriate if the telecommunications provider can demonstrate that the percentage used is a reasonable approximation of the Illinois portion of the channel.

G) Any method of approximation used by a telecommunications provider shall be subject to verification by the Department. So long as a method of approximation is reasonable and does not distort the Illinois portion of the interstate inter-office channel, it will be accepted by the Department. The telecommunication provider's method of approximation will be an acceptable method unless the Department demonstrates that the method distorts the Illinois portion of the interstate inter-office channel by more than 10 percent. Acceptance within this 10 percent tolerance is conditioned upon the telecommunications provider maintaining complete books and records and supplying those records for examination upon the Department's request.

4) "Gross charges" for private line service do not include any charge for a private line service that does not have an origination or termination in Illinois.

Example: In a private line service from New York to Los Angeles that traverses channel points in Illinois, none of the Illinois portion of the private line is subject to Illinois telecommunications excise tax.

## SUBPART E: SPECIAL PERMITS AND PLATES

**Section 1010.420 Temporary Permit Pending Registration In Illinois**

- a) General Provisions
  - 1) For the purpose of this Part, Illinois Temporary Registration Permit (hereinafter referred to as Temporary Permit) shall refer to a temporary ~~card or~~ plate, issued or provided by the Secretary of State, which allows the operation of a vehicle after proper application has been made and fees received, until the receipt of registration plates and/or sticker.
  - 2) The Secretary of State shall ~~determine whether Temporary Permits are to be issued in the form of Temporary Permit cards or Temporary Permit plates or both, and shall~~ prescribe the form and content of the Temporary Permit ~~card and~~ plate. ~~If Temporary Permit plates are utilized, they~~ shall

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include both a standard size plate and a reduced size plate for use on motor driven cycles or motorcycles. The Secretary of State shall issue the Temporary Permit and no other document shall be deemed a valid Temporary Permit. This provision shall in no way be construed as restricting the provisions of Section 3-401 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

- 3) ~~Entities The Secretary of State shall determine whether an issuer of Temporary Permits will be authorized to issue Temporary Permit cards or Temporary Permit plates or both. If the Secretary of State determines that only Temporary Permit plates are to be issued in Illinois, entities~~ authorized to issue Temporary Permit plates ~~Permits~~ pursuant to Section 1010.421 of this Part shall have the necessary computer hardware, software and communication devices for accessing the Secretary of State's Internet site for the registration of Temporary Permit plates.
- 4) The Temporary Permit shall not be valid for more than 90 days from the date of issuance, unless extended or reduced at the discretion of the Secretary of State. In exercising that discretion, the Secretary of State shall take into consideration the following factors:
  - A) The nature and type of application;
  - B) The availability of the registration plates and/or stickers applied for;
  - C) The processing time for the application;
  - D) Other relevant matters affecting the issuance thereof.In any event, once the applied-for registration plates and/or stickers have been issued to and received by the applicant, the Temporary Permit is void.
- 5) ~~The Temporary Permit card or plate must be displayed on the vehicle for which it is issued as follows:~~
  - A) ~~The Temporary Permit card may be displayed in the lower left corner of the back window;~~
  - B) ~~The Temporary Permit card may be displayed in the lower left corner of the front window;~~
  - C) ~~The Temporary Permit card may be displayed in the lower right corner of the front window;~~
  - D) ~~The Temporary Permit plate shall be securely attached to the rear of the vehicle in the space designed for the permanent registration plate, consistent with the provisions of Section 3-413(b) of the Illinois Vehicle Code.~~

The Temporary Permit plate shall be securely attached to the rear of the vehicle in the space designed for the permanent registration plate, consistent with the provisions of Section 3-413(b) of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

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- 6) The Temporary Permit must be removed upon receipt of the registration plates and/or sticker. The Temporary Permit is not transferable from one person to another, nor from vehicle to vehicle.
- b) Newly Acquired Vehicles  
A Temporary Permit to operate a newly acquired vehicle for which a valid application for title and registration has been filed, accompanied with the proper fees, may be issued by or for the Secretary of State to the buyer of such vehicle, pending action upon ~~the said~~ application.
- c) Renewal Registrations  
In the event that an individual fails to renew a registration plate or sticker upon expiration, a Temporary Permit may be issued only by a Secretary of State facility, or remittance agent, and only under the following circumstances:
- 1) The applicant presents proof of ownership of the vehicle through a title, preprinted application, I.D. Card, or ~~through~~ verification of ownership by the records of the Secretary of State.
  - 2) The applicant presents payment of all fees due.
  - 3) The renewal registration plates and/or stickers are not readily available at a financial institution, as defined in Section 1010.240 of this Part.
  - 4) The appropriate registration stickers or registration plates are not immediately available at a facility.
- d) Miscellaneous Provisions  
The Secretary of State may also issue Temporary Permits only at official State of Illinois facilities in any of the following situations:
- 1) If an individual has made application for registration, either renewal or otherwise, prior to expiration and does not receive the registration by the expiration date. The individual must present proof thereof acceptable to the Secretary of State;
  - 2) Any situation where the individual makes proper application for title and registration, or registration alone, and the Secretary of State is unable to issue the appropriate registration at that time.

**Section 1010.421 Issuance of Temporary Registration Permits by Persons or Entities Other Than the Secretary of State**

- a) In addition to the issuance of Temporary Permits to specific applicants, the Secretary of State may supply, upon request, Temporary Permit ~~cards or~~ ~~Temporary Permit~~ plates to the following for issuance by them, provided they have the necessary computer hardware, software and communication devices for

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accessing the Secretary of State's Internet site for the registration of Temporary Permit plates:

- 1) Licensed vehicle dealers registered and in good standing with the Secretary of State. Each dealer may issue Temporary Permits only to persons purchasing vehicles from that dealer and only after application for title and registration has been completed. The Secretary shall, upon determination by any court proceeding or at an administrative hearing, decline to issue such permits to any dealer or demand return of unused permits for violating any provision of the Illinois Vehicle Code, or any administrative rule adopted pursuant to the Vehicle Code, for the failure to keep records or make computer entries as required by this Section, or for any other violation relating to the use or issuance of Temporary Permits. Secretary of State personnel may initiate an action against a dealer by filing a complaint with the Secretary of State's Administrative Hearings Department. Thereafter, a notice of hearing shall be issued to the dealer specifying the alleged violations. The dealer shall be entitled to an administrative hearing pursuant to Section 2-118 of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/2-118] and regulations promulgated thereunder. All dealers receiving such Temporary Permits shall maintain records reflecting the information required for completion of the ~~Temporary Permit card or the~~ receipt form for a Temporary Permit plate. Failure to do so could result in the denial, revocation, or suspension of a dealer's license under Section 5-501 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.
- 2) Licensed remittance agents registered and in good standing with the Secretary of State. Each Remittance Agent may issue Temporary Permits only to persons whose applications the remittance agent accepts for transmittal to the Secretary of State. The Secretary shall, upon determination by any court proceeding or at an administrative hearing, decline to issue such permits to any remittance agent or demand return of unused permits for violating any provision of the Illinois Vehicle Code, or any administrative rule adopted pursuant to the Vehicle Code, for failure to keep records or make computer entries as required by this Section, or for any other violation relating to the use or issuance of Temporary Permits. Secretary of State personnel may initiate an action against a remittance agent by filing a complaint with the Secretary of State's Administrative Hearings Department. Thereafter, a notice of hearing shall be issued to the remittance agent specifying the alleged violations. The remittance agent shall be entitled to an administrative hearing pursuant to Section 2-118 of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/2-118] and regulations promulgated thereunder. All Remittance Agents receiving

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such Temporary Permits shall maintain records reflecting the information required for completion of the ~~Temporary Permit card or the~~ receipt form for a Temporary Permit. Failure to do so could result in the denial, revocation, or suspension of a Remittance Agent's license under Sections 3-906 and 3-907 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

- 3) Currency Exchanges licensed by, and in good standing with, the Department of Financial Institutions. Currency Exchanges shall complete and submit an application in a manner prescribed by the Secretary of State to be eligible to receive Temporary Permits. Each Currency Exchange may issue Temporary Permits only to persons whose applications the Currency Exchange accepts for transmittal to the Secretary of State. A Temporary Permit may only be issued in connection with an application for title and registration or registration only, but may not be issued in connection with an application for renewal of a registration. All Currency Exchanges receiving Temporary Permits shall maintain records of their issuance reflecting the information required for completion of ~~the Temporary Permit card or~~ the receipt form for a Temporary Permit plate. The Secretary shall, upon determination by any court proceeding or at an administrative hearing, decline to issue Temporary Permits to any Currency Exchange that has committed any violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code, or any administrative rule adopted pursuant to the Vehicle Code, for failure to keep records or make computer entries as required by this Section, or for any other violation relating to the use or issuance of Temporary Permits. Secretary of State personnel may initiate an action against a Currency Exchange by filing a complaint with the Secretary of State's Administrative Hearings Department. Thereafter, a notice of hearing shall be issued to the Currency Exchange specifying the alleged violations. The Currency Exchange shall be entitled to an administrative hearing pursuant to Section 2-118 of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/2-118] and regulations promulgated thereunder.

- b) Issuers of Temporary Permits must be in compliance with the following:
- 1) Within two business days after receipt of Temporary Permit plates from the Secretary of State the issuer shall access the Secretary of State's Internet site for the registration of Temporary Permit plates and acknowledge receipt of the plates. The issuer shall store the Temporary Permit plates in a secure location to prevent theft, loss or misuse of the plates. Temporary ~~Permit plates permits~~ shall be issued in numerical sequence as received from the Secretary of State. Temporary Permit plates shall be issued only in conjunction with applications for vehicle registration and all required information regarding the Temporary Permit

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- plate shall be completed on the vehicle registration application form.
- 2) Contemporaneous with the issuance of a Temporary Permit plate, the issuer shall access the Secretary of State's Internet site for the registration of Temporary Permit plates and enter all requested information with regard to the vehicle for which the Temporary Permit plate was issued and the individual(s) or entity to which the Temporary Permit plate was issued. When accessing the Secretary of State's Internet site and entering information, issuers shall comply with all protocols provided by the Secretary of State, including, but not limited to, user identification procedures and password.
  - 3) Prior to delivering a Temporary Permit plate to the applicant or attaching a Temporary Permit plate to a vehicle, the issuer shall lift the clear overlay covering the expiration date area, blacken in with a permanent black marker the month and year during which the Temporary Permit will expire, making certain to blacken in the entire box including the portion of the silver hologram strip running through the box designating the month, and remove the white backing from the overlay and apply the overlay securely over the expiration date area.
  - 4) Temporary Permit plates issued for motor driven cycles or motorcycles shall be of the reduced size designed for motor driven cycles or motorcycles.
  - 5) Temporary ~~Permit plates permits~~ shall be issued only by the Dealer, Remittance Agent, or Currency Exchange that received the Temporary Permit from the Secretary of State.
  - 6) Temporary Permit ~~plate cards and Temporary Permit plates~~ receipt forms shall contain all of the information requested, where applicable. The original of the plate receipt form shall be given to the applicant and the copy shall be maintained by the issuer.
  - 7) Temporary Permit ~~cards and Temporary Permit~~ plate receipt forms shall bear the name of the issuing entity and the signature of the issuing employee.
  - 8) Issuers of Temporary Permits shall reimburse the Secretary of State \$50 per Temporary Permit for lost, missing, stolen, or destroyed Temporary Permits. The Secretary of State shall have the discretion to waive this fee upon satisfactory proof that the Temporary Permits were destroyed by fire or flood, or stolen in connection to a theft of the premises. In the decision to waive the fee, the Secretary of State shall consider whether an insurance claim or police report was filed, or other evidence suggesting that the issuer's loss is the result of fire, flood, or theft of the premises.
  - 9) Issuers shall maintain copies of ~~all Temporary Permit cards and~~ receipt

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forms for all Temporary Permit plates issued for a period of 3 years.

- 10) When the issuer is no longer engaged in the business of issuing Temporary Permits, the issuer shall return all ~~Temporary Permit books from which Temporary Permits were issued and all~~ unissued Temporary Permit ~~cards and/or~~ plates to the Secretary of State. Issuer shall bear risk of loss until all Temporary Permits are received by the Secretary of State.
- c) The Secretary of State shall have free access to the offices and places of business to examine fully all temporary permit books and other business records, documents, and files of the issuer to determine whether such issuer is complying with the provisions of this Section.
- d) The issuer is responsible for acts or omissions of issuer's employees while engaged in the distribution of Temporary Permits.

Section 1040.53 Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program

a) For purposes of this part, the following definitions shall apply:

"Cancellation" – The without prejudice annulment or termination by formal action of the Secretary of a Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program's (GDLRP) authorization, or a Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program Instructor's (GDLRPI) authorization because of some error or defect in the license or because the licensee is in some form of violation of any of the requirements in the Illinois Vehicle Code or Illinois Administrative Code, which annulment or termination shall not be subject to renewal or restoration except that an application for a new authorization may be presented and acted upon by the Secretary after the authorized individual demonstrates compliance with the provisions of this Part for which the cancellation was issued.

"Commercial Driver Training Section" – A unit of the Department of Driver Services that oversees the regulation of graduated drivers license remedial programs.

"Department" – Department of Driver Services within the Office of the Secretary of State.

"Fraud" – Includes anything calculated to deceive, whether it be a single act or combination of circumstances, whether the suppression of truth or the suggestion of what is false, whether it be by direct falsehood or by innuendo, by speech or by silence.

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"Revocation" – The termination by formal action of the Secretary of a Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program authorization or a Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program Instructor's authorization, which termination shall be subject to renewal or restoration identical to the provisions for revocation of a driver's license as provided in Section 1-176 of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/1-176].

"Sex and Drug Related Offenses" – Offenses of criminal sexual assault [720 ILCS 5/12-13], aggravated criminal sexual assault [720 ILCS 5/12-14], criminal sexual abuse [720 ILCS 5/12-15], aggravated criminal sexual abuse [720 ILCS 5/12-16], juvenile pimping [720 ILCS 5/11-19.1]; soliciting for a juvenile prostitute [720 ILCS 5/11-15.1], unauthorized manufacture or delivery of a controlled substance, which shall include counterfeit drugs [720 ILCS 570/401], sale, delivery or exchange of instruments used for illegal drug use or abuse [720 ILCS 5/22-51], delivery of a controlled substance which includes counterfeit and look alike substances [720 ILCS 570/407], manufacture or delivery of cannabis [720 ILCS 550/5], delivery of cannabis [720 ILCS 550/7], the production of the cannabis plant [720 ILCS 550/8], illegal possession in a motor vehicle of any controlled substance, or any cannabis [625 ILCS 5/6-206(a)(28)], the criminal transmission of HIV [720 ILCS 5/12-16.2], exploitation of a child [720 ILCS 5/11-19.2], controlled substance trafficking [720 ILCS 570/401.17], cannabis trafficking [720 ILCS 550/5.1], delivery of cannabis on school grounds [720 ILCS 550/5.2], calculated criminal cannabis conspiracy [720 ILCS 550/9], calculated criminal drug conspiracy [720 ILCS 570/405], and criminal drug conspiracy [720 ILCS 570/405.1].

"Suspension" – the procedures for temporary withdrawal of a Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program authorization, or a Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program Instructor's authorization identical to the provisions for the suspension of a driver's license as provided in Section 1-204 of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/1-204].

b) Authorization Required

No person, firm, association, partnership or corporation shall operate a Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program unless an authorization therefor has been issued by the Secretary of State.

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- c) Issuance of Authorization to Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program and Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program Instructors
- 1) The Secretary of State shall issue an authorization to each applicant to conduct a GDLRP or to each Graduated GDLRPI when the Secretary of State is satisfied that the applicant has met the qualifications required under this Part.
  - 2) All outstanding authorizations issued to any GDLRP or GDLRPI shall remain valid indefinitely, unless cancelled, suspended or revoked.
- d) Requirements for Graduated Driver's License Remedial Programs
- 1) An authorization from the Department is required before a person or entity shall provide a GDLRP.
  - 2) The Department shall not issue a GDLRP authorization to any person or entity unless:
    - A) The physical facilities meet the requirements of this Part.
    - B) A curriculum is submitted to, and approved by, the Department.

The curriculum must contain the following:

      - i) The course must contain a minimum of 4 hours of instruction and not more than 9 hours of instruction.
      - ii) The course must be given in its entirety.
      - iii) The course must be highly interactive with group discussions. The entire curriculum should not be presented in lecture format.
    - C) The curriculum content must cover the following topics:
      - i) Attitude and behavior modification.
      - ii) Full review and discussion with each student of his/her reasons for attending the course.
      - iii) Explanation of the problems caused by each student's behavior and driving habits.
      - iv) Identification of effective driving behaviors.
      - v) Recommendations for changing problem driving behaviors.
      - vi) Rules of the Road – A brief review of both local and State of Illinois traffic laws, including but not limited to the following: graduated licensing law, zero tolerance law, seat safety belt laws, suspension/revocation laws, recent driver statistics, and State insurance requirements.
- e) Testing. The course must contain a final review test that summarizes all course materials. A 70% accuracy rate must be achieved to receive remedial course completion certificate.
- f) Evidence of experience in operating a driver training or driver improvement program is provided to the Department.

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- g) A representative of the GDLRP shall attend a training session with the Driver Services Department in order to review proper procedures and responsibilities.
- h) Each GDLRP must establish reasonable course fees to accomplish the proposed goals of the remedial training. The overall course fee must not exceed \$100 for the required minimum of 4 hours and maximum 9 hours of remedial training.
- i) Each GDLRP must provide security for all financial, personal, technical, and other data relating to each student. Security of data shall include prevention from use and disclosure by the remedial provider other than as authorized by the Secretary of State.
- j) Each GDLRP must maintain a single location, web site, e-mail address and/or telephone number available to students for registration, scheduling, complaints and general inquiries.
- k) Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program Locations and Facilities  
1) GDLRP courses must be held in locations open to the public.  
2) GDLRP courses shall not be held in a house trailer, residence, tent, temporary stand, temporary address, hotel room, rooming house, apartment house, or telephone answering service.  
3) Each authorized GDLRP must maintain an office for the administration of the program.  
4) The required records of all students must be maintained at this location.  
5) The office shall be open to the general public during posted hours on file with the Secretary of State, a minimum of 8 hours per week. The 8 hours must be on Monday through Friday between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.
- l) Inspection of GDLRP Facilities  
Each authorized Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program shall permit authorized representatives of the Office of the Secretary of State to conduct unscheduled periodic inspections of locations, records and classes.
- m) Records  
Each authorized GDLRP must:  
1) Maintain individual student course records of all enrollees for a period of 4 years.  
2) Maintain attendance records, signed by each student, indicating dates and locations of class session.  
3) Maintain test results for each student.  
4) Provide a certificate of completion to each qualifying student.
- n) Required communication with the Office of the Secretary of State  
1) Authorized GDLRPs must:  
A) Provide the Secretary of State with a copy of the certificate of completion for each qualifying student.

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- B) Receive written approval from the Secretary of State before changing the curriculum.
- 2) Maintain a central telephone number for the purpose of communicating with the Secretary of State regarding all aspects of the program.
- 3) Provide the Secretary of State with the time, date and location of each class session at least one week prior to the commencement of each class session.
- o) Requirements to obtain and retain a Graduated Commercial Driver's License Remedial Program Instructors Authorization
  - 1) The Secretary of State shall not issue, or shall deny, cancel, suspend or revoke, a Graduated GDLRPI authorization:
    - A) Has not held a valid driver's license for any 2 year period preceding the date of application for an instructor's authorization;
    - B) Has been convicted of 3 or more offenses against traffic regulations governing the movement of traffic within the 2 year period immediately preceding the date of application for an instructor's authorization;
    - C) Has had 2 or more convictions of a violation that caused an auto accident within the 2 year period immediately preceding the date of application for an instructor's authorization;
    - D) Has been convicted of driving under the influence of alcohol and/or other drugs, pursuant to Section 11-501 of the Illinois Rules of the Road of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/11-501], leaving the scene of a fatal accident, pursuant to Section 11-401 of the Illinois Rules of the Road of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/11-401], reckless homicide, pursuant to Section 9-3 of the Criminal Code of 1961 [720 ILCS 5/9-3], reckless driving, pursuant to Section 11-503 of the Illinois Rules of the Road of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/11-503], or any sex or drug related offense within 10 years prior to date of application;
    - E) Fails to properly and fully complete an application for such authorization or otherwise indicates that he is unqualified to receive an authorization;
    - F) Is currently a salaried or contractual employee of the Secretary of State as mandated by the guidelines of the Secretary of State's Office Policy Manual that states that an employee shall not advocate or promote specific professional or commercial services to the public in matters under the jurisdiction of the Office of the Secretary of State;
    - G) Is not at least 21 years of age and a resident of the State of Illinois;

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- H) Has not graduated from an accredited high school or the equivalent;
- D) Does not qualify under one of the following requirements:
  - i) Be a certified teacher meeting the requirements of 23 Ill. Adm. Code 252.40(b)(3). (Minor – 16 semester hours)
  - ii) Hold a baccalaureate degree, have 1 year of teaching experience in primary, secondary or higher education and complete a 48 hour course approved by the Director of the Department.
  - iii) Complete the 48 hour course (a course, at least 48 hours in length designed to provide individuals with the knowledge, methods and procedures specific to conducting driver education instructional courses, that has been approved by the Department Director) or an equivalent college or university course approved by the Director of the Department and provide written documentation verifying they have had 2 months of experience teaching behind-the-wheel to adults.
  - iv) Hold a valid State teaching certificate and complete a 48 hour behind-the-wheel and classroom course approved by the Director of Driver Services.
  - v) To any person who is not of good moral character. In making a determination of good moral character, the Department is not limited to, but may consider the following:
- 2) If the instructor has been convicted of a felony:
  - A) The relationship of any crime of which the person has been convicted to the ability to instruct for a GDLRP; or
  - B) The opinions of the community members concerning the instructor; or
  - C) The length of time that has elapsed since the owner's last criminal conviction.
- 3) If the instructor has been indicted, formally charged or otherwise charged with a felony:
  - A) If the instructor whose GDLRPI authorization has been cancelled under this Part is adjudicated "guilty" by the court systems, the cancellation previously entered on his/her record in accordance with this Part shall stand. This action does not preclude further suspension and/or revocation of the GDLRPI authorization under another Section of this Part, or the Illinois Vehicle Code.

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- B) If the instructor whose GDLRPI authorization has been cancelled under this Part is adjudicated "not guilty" by the court system, the cancellation previously entered on the authorization in accordance with 92 Ill. Adm. Code 1060.190b) shall be rescinded. This action does not preclude further suspension and/or revocation of the GDLRPI authorization under another Section of this Part or the Illinois Vehicle Code.
- C) If the instructor whose GDLRPI authorization has been cancelled under this Part is granted a disposition of "court supervision" by the court system, the cancellation previously entered on the license in accordance with 92 Ill. Adm. Code 1060.190b) shall be rescinded. This action does not preclude further suspension and/or revocation of the GDLRPI authorization under another Section of this Part or the Illinois Vehicle Code.
- D) An individual whose GDLRPI authorization has been cancelled pursuant to this Section may request an administrative hearing pursuant to 92 Ill. Adm. Code 1001.
- p) During the course of instruction, an instructor shall not engage in activity unrelated to the required curriculum.
- q) Hearings  
Prior to the denial of an authorization of a GDLRP or GDLRPI Authorization, the Department shall send written notice to the school or person. If a formal hearing is requested in writing during the notice period, in accordance with 92 Ill. Adm. Code 1001.Subpart A and Section 2-118 of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/2-118] the denial shall stand pending the outcome of the hearing. The basis for denial of a license is stated in subsection (o) of this Section.
- r) Prior to the suspension or revocation of the authorization of a GDLRP or GDLRPI Authorization, the Department will conduct a hearing in accordance with 92 Ill. Adm. Code 1001.Subpart A and Section 2-118 of the Illinois Vehicle Code [625 ILCS 5/2-118], wherein the Department will present competent evidence to establish violations of any regulations or laws governing commercial driver training schools and/or instructors and seek the appropriate sanctions in accordance with this Part.
- s) Denial, Cancellation, Suspension, Revocation and Probation of Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program and Instructor Authorization
  - 1) The Secretary of State may deny, suspend, revoke or impose probation on a GDLRP or GDLRPI authorization Authorization for any violation of any requirements in this Section.
  - 2) The Secretary of State may cancel a Graduated Driver's License Remedial Program authorization of any individual whose commercial driver training

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school instructor authorization is currently cancelled, suspended or revoked.

- 3) The Secretary of State may cancel a instructor authorization, if it is determined a student did not receive the required course of instruction. The student will have the cancellation of his/her commercial driver's license reinstated and be required to complete the required course.

- s) Grandfathering of Existing Graduated Driver's License Remedial Programs  
Any GDLRP with a valid contract with the Office of the Secretary of State at the time this Section is adopted will be allowed to operate until its contract expires, even if the Graduated Commercial Driver's License Remedial Program does not meet the requirements of this Section.

- 15) Summary and Purpose of Amendment: These amendments regarding medical payment will implement a 24-month time limitation during which the Department will accept Medicare/Medicaid crossover claims for reimbursement. For Medicaid claims, federal regulations and the Department's administrative rules require receipt by the Department within 12 months after the date of service. However, the Department does not receive Medicare/Medicaid crossover claims until after the provider has received notice of the disposition of the Medicare claim. Because of this, the 12-month time frame is often inadequate and lengthy delays sometimes occur. These proposed changes concerning a 24-month time limitation for submitting Medicare/Medicaid crossover claims are intended to address these problems.

**Section 140.20 Submittal of Claims**

- a) When claims for payment are submitted to the Department, providers shall:
  - 1) Use Department designated billing forms for submittal of charges, and
  - 2) Certify that:
    - A) They have personally rendered the services and provided the items for which charges are being made,
    - B) Payment has not been received, or that only partial payment has been received,
    - C) The charge made for each item constitutes the complete charge,
    - D) They have not, and will not, accept additional payment for any item from any person or persons, and
    - E) They will not make additional charges to, nor accept additional payment from, any persons if the charges they present are reduced by the Department to conform to Department standards.
- b) Statement of Certification
  - 1) All billing statements shall contain a certification statement that which must remain unaltered, and must be legibly signed and dated in ink by the provider or his authorized representative. A rubber stamp or facsimile signature is not acceptable.
  - 2) An "authorized representative" may only be a trusted employee over whom the provider has direct supervision on a daily basis and who is personally responsible on a daily basis to the provider. Such representative must be specifically designated and must sign the provider's name and his or her own initials on each certification statement.
- c) To be eligible for payment consideration, a provider's vendor-payment claim or bill, either as an initial or resubmitted claim following prior rejection, must be received by the Department, or its fiscal intermediary, no later than twelve (12) months after from the date on which medical goods or services were are provided, with the following exception. The Department must receive a claim after disposition by Medicare or its fiscal intermediary no later than 24 months after the date on which medical goods or services were provided. This exception does not

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- d) apply to inpatient claims for participants with Medicare Part B coverage only. Claims ~~that-which~~ are not submitted and received in compliance with the foregoing requirements will not be eligible for payment under the Department's Medical Assistance Program, and the State shall have no liability for payment thereof.

- 15) Summary and Purpose of Amendments:

***Section 148.120 (26 Ill. Reg. 2974)***

These amendments pertaining to Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) adjustment payments are based upon a provision in the federal Medicare, Medicaid, and SCHIP Benefits Improvement and Protection Act of 2000, Section 701(d), which allows for annual DSH adjustment payments to qualifying public hospitals. The changes provide a methodology for calculating the payments and specify that hospitals must have in force an executed intergovernmental agreement with the Department.

***Sections 148.120 and 120.310 (26 Ill. Reg. 4056)***

These amendments concerning hospital services allow hospitals an alternative means to submit Medicaid and total hospital days data to the Department in the event of delays in Medicare processing. Changes to Section 148.120 require hospitals that do not have a cost report on file with the Department by April 30 to complete a Hospital Day Statistics Collection (HDSC) form with total Medicaid days and total hospital days for the hospital's base fiscal year. If the deadline for submitting base fiscal year Medicare cost reports is extended beyond the month of June preceding the Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) determination, the HDSC form will be used in the final DSH adjustment determination for all hospitals that do not have a cost report on file.

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Related amendments to Section 148.310 provide that inpatient utilization rates derived from HDSC forms are only subject to review for errors in calculation by the Department, and that hospitals have an opportunity to submit corrected information prior to the Department's final DSH determination.

**Section 148.120 Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) Adjustments**

Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) adjustments for inpatient services provided prior to October 1, 1993, shall be determined and paid in accordance with the statutes and administrative rules governing the time period when the services were rendered. The Department shall make an annual determination of those hospitals qualified for adjustments under this Section effective October 1, 1993, and each October 1, thereafter unless otherwise noted.

- a) Qualified Disproportionate Share Hospitals (DSH). For inpatient services provided on or after October 1, 1993, the Department shall make adjustment payments to hospitals which are deemed as disproportionate share by the Department. A hospital may qualify for a DSH adjustment in one of the following ways:
  - 1) The hospital's Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as defined in subsection (k)(5) of this Section, is at least one half standard deviation above the mean Medicaid utilization rate, as defined in subsection (k)(3) of this Section.
  - 2) The hospital's low income utilization rate exceeds 25 per centum. For this alternative, payments for all patient services (not just inpatient) for Medicaid, Family and Children Assistance (formerly known as General Assistance) and/or any local or State government-funded care, must be counted as a percentage of all net patient service revenue. To this percentage, the percentage of total inpatient charges attributable to inpatient charges for charity care (less payments for Family and Children Assistance inpatient hospital services, and/or any local or State government-funded care) must be added.
  - 3) Illinois hospitals that, on July 1, 1991, had a Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as defined in subsection (k)(5) of this Section, that was at least the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as defined in subsection (k)(3) of this Section, and which were located in a planning area with one-third or fewer excess beds as determined by the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Board (77 Ill. Adm. Code 1100), and that, as of June 30, 1992, were located in a federally designated Health Manpower Shortage Area (42 CFR 5, 1989).
  - 4) Illinois hospitals that:
    - A) Have a Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as defined in subsection (k)(5) of this Section, which is at least the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as defined in subsection (k)(3) of this Section, and

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- B) Have a Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rate, as defined in subsection (k)(6) of this Section, that is at least one standard deviation above the mean Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rate, as defined in subsection (k)(4) of this Section.
- 5) Any children's hospital, as defined in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(c)(3).
- b) In addition, to be deemed a DSH hospital, a hospital must provide the Department, in writing, with the names of at least 2 obstetricians with staff privileges at the hospital who have agreed to provide obstetric services to individuals entitled to such services under a State Medicaid plan. In the case of a hospital located in a rural area (that is, an area outside of a Metropolitan Statistical Area, as defined by the Executive Office of Management and Budget), the term "obstetrician" includes any physician with staff privileges at the hospital to perform nonemergency obstetric procedures. This requirement does not apply to a hospital in which the inpatients are predominantly individuals under 18 years of age; or does not offer nonemergency obstetric services as of December 22, 1987. Hospitals that do not offer nonemergency obstetrics to the general public, with the exception of those hospitals described in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(c)(1) through (c)(4), must submit a statement to that effect.
- c) In making the determination described in subsections (a)(1) and (a)(4)(A) of this Section, the Department shall utilize:
- 1) Hospital Cost Reports
- A1) The hospital's final audited cost report for the hospital's base fiscal year. Medicaid inpatient utilization rates, as defined in subsection (k)(5) of this Section, which have been derived from final audited cost reports, are not subject to the Review Procedure described in Section 148.310, with the exception of errors in calculation.
- B2) In the absence of a final audited cost report for the hospital's base fiscal year, the Department shall utilize the hospital's unaudited cost report for the hospital's base fiscal year. Due to the unaudited nature of this information, hospitals shall have the opportunity to submit a corrected cost report for the determination described in subsections (a)(1) and (a)(4)(A) of this Section. Submittal of a corrected cost report in support of subsections (a)(1) and (a)(4)(A) of this Section must be received or post marked no later than the first day of July preceding the DSH determination year for which the hospital is requesting consideration of such corrected cost report for the determination of DSH qualification. Corrected cost reports which are not received in compliance with these time limitations will not be considered for the determination of the hospital's Medicaid inpatient utilization rate as described in

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subsection (k)(5) of this Section.

- C) In the event of extensions to the Medicare cost report filing process, those hospitals that do not have an audited or unaudited base year Medicaid cost report on file with the Department by the 30th of April preceding the DSH determination are required to complete and submit to the Department a Hospital Day Statistics Collection (HDSC) form. On the form, hospitals must provide total Medicaid days and total hospital days for the hospital's base fiscal year. The HDSC form must be submitted to the Department by the April 30th preceding the DSH determination.
- i) If the Medicare deadline for submitting base fiscal year cost reports falls within the month of June preceding the DSH determination, hospitals, regardless of their base fiscal year end date, will have until the first day of August preceding the DSH determination to submit changes to their Medicaid cost reports for inclusion in the final DSH calculations. In this case, the HDSC form will not be used as a data source for the final rate year DSH determination.
- ii) If the Medicare deadline for submitting base fiscal year cost reports is extended beyond the month of June preceding the DSH determination, the HDSC form will be used in the final DSH determination for all hospitals that do not have an audited or unaudited Medicaid cost report on file with the Department. Hospitals will have until the first day of July to submit any adjustments to the information provided on the HDSC form sent to the Department on April 30.
- DA) Hospital's Medicaid inpatient utilization rates, as defined in subsection (k)(5) of this Section, which have been derived from unaudited cost reports or the HDSC form, are not subject to the Review Procedure described in Section 148.310, with the exception of errors in calculation. Pursuant to subsections (c)(1)(B) and (c)(1)(C)(ii) ~~subsection (e)(2)~~ of this Section, hospitals shall have the opportunity to submit corrected ~~cost report~~ information prior to the Department's final DSH determination.
- EB) In the event a subsequent final audited cost report reflects a Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as described in subsection (k)(5) of this Section, which is lower than the Medicaid inpatient utilization rate derived from the unaudited cost report or the HDSC form utilized for the DSH determination, the Department shall

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recalculate the Medicaid inpatient utilization rate based upon the final audited cost report, and recoup any overpayments made if the percentage change in the DSH payment rate is greater than five percent.

23) Days Not Available from Cost Report

Certain types of inpatient days of care provided to Title XIX recipients are not available from the cost report, i.e., Medicare/Medicaid crossover claims, out-of-state Title XIX Medicaid utilization levels, Medicaid Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) days, hospital residing long term care days, and Medicaid days for alcohol and substance abuse ~~rehabilitative~~ rehabilitative care under category of service 35. To obtain Medicaid utilization levels in these instances, the Department shall utilize:

- A) Medicare/Medicaid Crossover Claims.
- i) For DSH determination years on or after October 1, 1996, the Department will utilize the Department's paid claims data adjudicated through the last day of June preceding the DSH determination year for each hospital's base fiscal year. Provider logs as described in the following subsection (c)(3)(A)(ii) will not be used in the determination process for DSH determination years on or after October 1, 1996.
  - ii) For DSH determination years prior to October 1, 1996, hospitals may submit additional information to document Medicare/Medicaid crossover days that were not billed to the Department due to a determination that the Department had no liability for deductible or coinsurance amounts. That information must be submitted in log form. The log must include a patient account number or medical record number, patient name, Medicaid recipient identification number, Medicare identification number, date of admission, date of discharge, the number of covered days, and the total number of Medicare/Medicaid crossover days. That log must include all Medicare/Medicaid crossover days billed to the Department and all Medicare/Medicaid crossover days which were not billed to the Department for services provided during the hospital's base fiscal year. If a hospital does not submit a log of Medicare/Medicaid crossover days that meets the above requirements, the Department will utilize the Department's paid claims data adjudicated through the last day of June preceding the DSH determination year for the hospital's applicable base fiscal

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- year.
- B) Out-of-state Title XIX Utilization Levels. Hospital statements and verification reports from other states will be required to verify out-of-state Medicaid recipient utilization levels. The information submitted must include only those days of care provided to out-of-state Medicaid recipients during the hospital's base fiscal year.
  - C) HMO days. The Department will utilize the Department's HMO claims data available to the Department as of the last day of June preceding the DSH determination year, or specific claim information from each HMO, for each hospital's base fiscal year to determine the number of inpatient days provided to recipients enrolled in an HMO.
  - D) Hospital Residing Long Term Care Days. The Department will utilize the Department's paid claims data adjudicated through the last day of June preceding the DSH determination year for each hospital's base fiscal year to determine the number of hospital residing long term care days provided to recipients.
  - E) Alcohol and Substance Abuse Days. The Department will utilize its paid claims data under category of service 35 available to the Department as of the last day of June preceding the DSH determination year for each hospital's base fiscal year to determine the number of inpatient days provided for alcohol and substance abuse rehabilitative care.
- d) Hospitals may apply for DSH status under subsection (a)(2) of this Section by submitting an audited certified financial statement, for the hospital's base fiscal year, to the Department of Human Services. The statements must contain the following breakdown of information prior to submittal to the Department for consideration:
- 1) Total hospital net revenue for all patient services, both inpatient and outpatient, for the hospital's base fiscal year.
  - 2) Total payments received directly from State and local governments for all patient services, both inpatient and outpatient, for the hospital's base fiscal year.
  - 3) Total gross inpatient hospital charges for charity care (this must not include contractual allowances, bad debt or discounts, except contractual allowances and discounts for Family and Children Assistance, formerly known as General Assistance), for the hospital's base fiscal year.
  - 4) Total amount of the hospital's gross charges for inpatient hospital services for the hospital's base fiscal year.
- e) With the exception of cost-reporting children's hospitals in contiguous states that

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provide 100 or more inpatient days of care to Illinois program participants, only those cost-reporting hospitals located in states contiguous to Illinois that qualify for DSH in the state in which they are located based upon the ~~federal~~ **Federal** definition of a DSH hospital, as defined in Section 1923(b)(1) of the Social Security Act, may qualify for DSH hospital adjustments under this Section. For purposes of determining the Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as described in subsection (k)(5) of this Section and as required in Section 1923(b)(1) of the Social Security Act, out-of-state hospitals will be measured in relationship to one standard deviation above the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate in their state. Out-of-state hospitals that do not qualify by the Medicaid inpatient utilization rate from their state may submit an audited certified financial statement as described in subsection (d) of this Section. Payments to out-of-state hospitals will be allocated using the same method as described in subsection (g) of this Section.

- f) Time Limitation Requirements for Additional Information.
- 1) Except as provided in subsection (c)(1)(C), the ~~The~~ information required in subsections ~~(a)(a)(2)~~, (c), (d) and (e) of this Section must be received or post marked no later than the first day of July preceding the DSH determination year for which the hospital is requesting consideration of such information for the determination of DSH qualification. Information required in subsections ~~(a)(a)(2)~~, (c), (d) and (e) of this Section which is not received or post marked in compliance with these limitations will not be considered for the determination of those hospitals qualified for DSH adjustments.
  - 2) The information required in subsection (b) of this Section must be received or post marked within 30 calendar days after receipt of notification from the Department that the information must be submitted. Information required in this Section which is not received in compliance with these limitations will not be considered for the determination of those hospitals qualified for DSH adjustments.
- g) Inpatient Payment Adjustments to DSH Hospitals. The adjustment payments required by subsection (a) of this Section shall be calculated annually as follows:
- 1) Five Million Dollar Fund Adjustment for hospitals defined in Section 148.25(b)(1).
    - A) Hospitals qualifying as DSH hospitals under subsection (a)(1) of this Section that have a Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as described in subsection (k)(5) of this Section, which is at least one standard deviation above the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as described in subsection (k)(3) of this Section, and hospitals qualifying as DSH hospitals under subsection (a)(2) of this Section

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- will receive an add-on payment to their inpatient rate.
- B) The distribution method for the add-on payment described in subsection (g)(1)(A) of this Section is based upon a fund of \$5 million. All hospitals qualifying under subsection (g)(1)(A) of this Section will receive a \$5 per day add-on to their current rate. The total cost of this adjustment is calculated by multiplying each hospital's most recent completed fiscal year Medicaid inpatient utilization data (adjusted based upon historical utilization and projected increases in utilization) by \$5. The total dollar amount of this calculation is then subtracted from the \$5 million fund.
- C) The remaining fund balance is then distributed to the hospitals that qualify under subsection (a)(1) of this Section that have a Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as described in subsection (k)(5) of this Section, which is at least one standard deviation above the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, in proportion to the percentage by which the hospital's Medicaid inpatient utilization rate exceeds one standard deviation above the State's mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as described in subsection (k)(3) of this Section. This is done by finding the ratio of each hospital's percent Medicaid utilization to the State's mean plus one standard deviation percent Medicaid value. These ratios are then summed and each hospital's proportion of the total is calculated. These proportional values are then multiplied by each hospital's most recent completed fiscal year Medicaid inpatient utilization data (adjusted based upon historical utilization and projected increases in utilization). These weighted values are summed and each hospital's proportion of the summed weighted value is calculated. Each individual hospital's proportional value is then multiplied against the \$5 million pool of money available after the \$5 per day base add-on has been subtracted.
- D) The total dollar amount calculated for each qualifying hospital under subsection (g)(1)(C) of this Section, plus the initial \$5 per day add-on amount calculated for each qualifying hospital under subsection (g)(1)(B) of this Section, is then divided by the Medicaid inpatient utilization data (adjusted based upon historical utilization and projected increases in utilization) to arrive at per day add-on value. Hospitals qualifying under subsection (a)(2) of this Section, will receive the minimum adjustment of \$5 per inpatient day. The adjustments calculated under this subsection (g)(1)(D) are subject to the limitations described in subsection (j)

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of this Section.

- 2) Medicaid Percentage Adjustment for hospitals defined in Section 148.25(b)(1), excluding hospitals defined in Section 148.25(b)(1)(A).
  - A) In addition to the adjustment methodology described in subsection (g)(1) of this Section, all DSH hospitals described in subsections (a)(1), (2), (3), (4), and (5) of this Section shall receive a payment adjustment which shall be calculated annually as outlined in subsection (g)(2)(B). ~~follows:~~
  - B) The payment adjustment shall be calculated based upon the hospital's Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as defined in subsection (k)(5) of this Section, and subject to subsections (h) and (i) of this Section, as follows:
    - i) Hospitals with a Medicaid inpatient utilization rate below the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate shall receive a payment adjustment of \$25;
    - ii) Hospitals with a Medicaid inpatient utilization rate that is equal to or greater than the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate but less than one standard deviation above the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate shall receive a payment adjustment of \$25 plus \$1 for each one percent that the hospital's Medicaid inpatient utilization rate exceeds the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate;
    - iii) Hospitals with a Medicaid inpatient utilization rate that is equal to or greater than one standard deviation above the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate but less than 1.5 standard deviations above the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate shall receive a payment adjustment of \$40 plus \$7 for each one percent that the hospital's Medicaid inpatient utilization rate exceeds one standard deviation above the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate; and
    - iv) Hospitals with a Medicaid inpatient utilization rate that is equal to or greater than 1.5 standard deviations above the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate shall receive a payment adjustment of \$90 plus \$2 for each one percent that the hospital's Medicaid inpatient utilization rate exceeds 1.5 standard deviations above the mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate.
  - C) For a hospital organized under the University of Illinois Hospital Act, as described in Section 148.25(b)(1)(B), the amount calculated pursuant to subsection (g)(2)(B) of this Section shall be

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- increased by \$60 per day.
- D) The Medicaid percentage adjustment payment, calculated in accordance with this subsection (g)(2), to a hospital, other than a hospital and/or hospitals organized under the University of Illinois Hospital Act, as described in Section 148.25(b)(1)(B), shall not exceed \$155 per day for a children's hospital, as defined in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(c)(3)~~described in subsection (a)(5) of this Section~~, and shall not exceed \$215 per day for all other hospitals.
- E) The amount calculated pursuant to subsections (g)(2)(B) through (g)(2)(D) of this Section shall be adjusted on October 1, 1993, and annually thereafter by a percentage equal to the lesser of:
- i) The increase in the national hospital market basket price proxies (DRI) hospital cost index for the most recent 12 month period for which data are available; or
  - ii) The percentage increase in the statewide average hospital payment rate, as described in subsection (k)(8) of this Section, over the previous year's statewide average hospital payment rate.
- F) The amount calculated pursuant to subsection (g)(1) of this Section for hospitals described in Section 148.25(b)(1)(A) shall be no less than the DSH rates in effect on June 1, 1992, except that this minimum shall be adjusted on the first day of July of each year by the annual percentage change in the per diem cost of inpatient hospital services as reported on the two most recent annual Medicaid cost reports. The per diem cost of inpatient hospital services is calculated by dividing the total allowable Medicaid costs by the total allowable Medicaid days.
- G) The amount calculated pursuant to subsections (g)(1) and (g)(2)(B) through (g)(2)(E) of this Section, as adjusted pursuant to subsections (h) and (i) of this Section, shall be the inpatient payment adjustment in dollars for the applicable DSH determination year, subject to the limitations described in subsections (g)(2)(D) and (j) of this Section, and the adjustment described in subsection (g)(2)(F) of this Section. The adjustments calculated under subsections (g)(1) and (g)(2)(B) through (g)(2)(F) of this Section shall be paid on a per diem basis and shall be applied to each covered day of care provided.
- 3) Department of Human Services (DHS) State-Operated Facility Adjustment for hospitals defined in Section 148.25(b)(6). Department of Human Services State-operated facilities qualifying under subsection

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(a)(2) of this Section shall receive an adjustment for inpatient services provided on or after March 1, 1995. Effective October 1, 2000, the adjustment payment shall be calculated as follows:

- A) The amount of the adjustment is based on a State DSH Pool. The State DSH Pool amount shall be the lesser of the federal DSH allotment for mental health facilities as determined in section 1923(h) of the Social Security Act, minus the estimated DSH payments to such facilities that are not operated by the State; or the result of subtracting the estimated DSH payment adjustments made under subsections (g)(1) through (g)(2) of this Section and Section 148.170(f)(2) from the aggregate DSH payment allotment as provided for in Section 1923(f) of the Social Security Act.
- B) The State DSH Pool amount is then allocated to hospitals defined in Section 148.25(b)(6) that qualify for DSH adjustments by multiplying the State DSH Pool amount by each hospital's ratio of uncompensated care costs, from the most recent final cost report, to the sum of all qualifying hospitals' uncompensated care costs.
- C) The adjustment calculated in subsection (g)(3)(B) of this Section shall meet the limitation described in subsection (j)(4) of this Section.
- D) The adjustment calculated pursuant to subsection (g)(3)(B) of this Section, for each hospital defined in Section 148.25(b)(6) that qualifies for DSH adjustments, is then divided by four to arrive at a quarterly adjustment. This amount is subject to the limitations described in subsection (j) of this Section. The adjustment described in this subsection (g)(3)(D) shall be paid on a quarterly basis.

4) Assistance for Certain Public Hospitals

- A) Effective May 1, 2002, the Department may make an annual payment adjustment to qualifying hospitals in the D.H. determination year. A qualifying hospital is a public hospital as defined in section 701(d) of the Medicare, Medicaid, and SCHIP Benefits Improvement and Protection Act of 2000 (Public Law 106-554).
- B) Hospitals qualifying shall receive an annual payment adjustment that is equal to:
  - i) A rate amount equal to the amount specified in the Medicare, Medicaid, and SCHIP Benefits Improvement and Protection Act of 2000, section 701(d)(3)(B) for the D.H. determination year;

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- ii) Divided first by Illinois' Federal Medical Assistance Percentage; and
    - iii) Divided secondly by the sum of the qualified hospitals' total Medicaid inpatient days, as defined in subsection (k)(9) of this Section; and
    - iv) Multiplied by each qualified hospital's Medicaid inpatient days as defined in subsection (k)(9) of this Section.
  - C) The payment adjustment under this subsection (g)(4) shall be made at least quarterly except for D.H. rate year 2002 when the annual payment adjustment calculated under this subsection (g)(4), for each qualified hospital, will be divided by two and paid on a quarterly basis. For D.H. rate years after D.H. rate year 2002, the annual payment adjustment calculated under this subsection, for each qualified hospital, will be divided by four and paid on a quarterly basis.
  - D) Payment adjustments under this subsection (g)(4) shall be made without regard to subsections (j)(3) and (4) of this Section, 42 CFR 447.272, or any standards promulgated by the Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to section 701(e) of the Medicare, Medicaid, and SCHIP Benefits Improvement and Protection Act of 2000.
  - E) In order to qualify for assistance payments under this subsection (g)(4), with regard to this payment adjustment, there must be in force an executed intergovernmental agreement between the authorized governmental body of the qualifying hospital and the Department.
- h) Inpatient Adjustor for Children's Hospitals. For a children's hospital, as defined in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(c)(3)-subsection (a)(5) of this Section, the payment adjustment calculated under subsection (g)(2) of this Section shall be multiplied by 2.0.
  - i) Inpatient Adjustor for Hospitals Organized under the University of Illinois Hospital Act. For a hospital and/or hospitals organized under the University of Illinois Hospital Act, as defined in Section 148.25(b)(1)(B), the payment adjustment calculated under subsection (g)(2) of this Section shall be multiplied by 1.50.
  - j) DSH Adjustment Limitations.
    - 1) Hospitals that qualify for DSH adjustments under this Section shall not be eligible for the total DSH adjustment if, during the DSH determination year, the hospital discontinues provision of nonemergency obstetrical care. The provisions of ~~the~~ this subsection (j)(1) shall not apply to those

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hospitals described in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(c)(1) through (c)(4) or those hospitals that have not offered nonemergency obstetric services as of December 22, 1987). In this instance, the adjustments calculated under subsections (g)(1) and (g)(2) shall cease effective on the date that the hospital discontinued the provision of such ~~nonemergency non-emergency~~ obstetrical care.

- 2) Inpatient Payment Adjustments based upon DSH Determination Reviews. Appeals based upon a hospital's ineligibility for DSH payment adjustments, or their payment adjustment amounts, in ~~provision of non-emergency obstetrical care (the provisions of~~ accordance with Section 148.310(b), which result in a change in a hospital's eligibility for DSH payment adjustments or a change in a hospital's payment adjustment amounts, shall not affect the DSH status of any other hospital or the payment adjustment amount of any other hospital that has received notification from the Department of ~~its their~~ eligibility for DSH payment adjustments based upon the requirements of this Section.
- 3) DSH Payment Adjustment. In accordance with Public Law 102-234, if the aggregate DSH payment adjustments calculated under this Section do not meet the State's final DSH Allotment as determined by the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA), DSH payment adjustments calculated under this Section shall be adjusted to meet the State DSH Allotment. This adjustment shall first be applied to DSH payments made under subsection (g)(3) of this Section. If further adjustments are necessary, then DSH payments made under subsection (g)(2) of this Section shall be adjusted, with the DSH payments made under subsection (g)(1) of this Section being adjusted last.
- 4) Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993 (OBRA '93) Adjustments. In accordance with Public Law 103-66, adjustments to individual hospitals' disproportionate share payments shall be made if the sum of estimated Medicaid payments (inpatient, outpatient, and disproportionate share) to a hospital exceed the costs of providing services to Medicaid clients and persons without insurance. Federal upper payment limit requirements (42 CFR 447.272) shall be considered when calculating the OBRA '93 adjustments. The adjustments shall reduce disproportionate share spending until the costs and spending (described in this subsection (j)(4)) are equal or until the disproportionate share payments are reduced to zero. In this calculation, persons without insurance costs do not include contractual allowances. Hospitals qualifying for DSH payment adjustments must submit the information required in Section 148.150.
- 5) Medicaid Inpatient Utilization Rate Limit. Hospitals that qualify for DSH

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payment adjustments under this Section shall not be eligible for DSH payment adjustments if the hospital's Medicaid inpatient utilization rate, as defined in subsection (k)(5) of this Section, is less than one percent.

- k) Inpatient Payment Adjustment Definitions. The definitions of terms used with reference to calculation of the inpatient payment adjustments are as follows:
- 1) "Base fiscal year" means, for example, the hospital's fiscal year ending in 1991 for the October 1, 1993 DSH determination year, the hospital's fiscal year ending in 1992 for the October 1, 1994, DSH determination year, etc.
  - 2) "DSH determination year" means the 12 month period beginning on October 1 of the year and ending September 30 of the following year.
  - 3) "Mean Medicaid inpatient utilization rate" means a fraction, the numerator of which is the total number of inpatient days provided in a given 12-month period by all Medicaid-participating Illinois hospitals to patients who, for such days, were eligible for Medicaid under Title XIX of the ~~federal Federal~~ Social Security Act (42 USC 1396a et seq.), and the denominator of which is the total number of inpatient days provided by those same hospitals. Title XIX specifically excludes days of care provided to Family and Children Assistance (formerly known as General Assistance) but does include the types of days described in subsections (c)(1) and (c)(2)~~subsection (e)(3)~~ of this Section. In this subsection (k)(3), the term "inpatient day" includes each day in which an individual (including a newborn) is an inpatient in the hospital whether or not the individual is in a specialized ward and whether or not the individual remains in the hospital for lack of suitable placement elsewhere.
  - 4) "Mean Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rate" means a fraction, the numerator of which is the total Medicaid (Title XIX) obstetrical inpatient days, as defined in subsection (k)(7) of this Section, provided by all Medicaid-participating Illinois hospitals providing obstetrical services to patients who, for such days, were eligible for Medicaid under Title XIX of the ~~federal Federal~~ Social Security Act (42 USC 1396a et seq.), and the denominator of which is the total Medicaid (Title XIX) inpatient days, as defined in subsection (k)(9) of this Section, for all such hospitals. That information shall be derived from claims for applicable services provided in the Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rate base year which were subsequently adjudicated by the Department through the last day of June preceding the DSH determination year and contained within the Department's paid claims data base.
  - 5) "Medicaid inpatient utilization rate" means a fraction, the numerator of which is the number of a hospital's inpatient days provided in a given 12-month period to patients who, for such days, were eligible for Medicaid

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under Title XIX of the ~~Federal federal~~ Social Security Act (42 USC 1396a et seq.) and the denominator of which is the total number of the hospital's inpatient days in that same period. Title XIX specifically excludes days of care provided to Family and Children Assistance (formerly known as General Assistance) but does include the types of days described in subsections (c)(1) and (c)(2) ~~subsection (e)(3)~~ of this Section. In this subsection (k)(5), the term "inpatient day" includes each day in which an individual (including a newborn) is an inpatient in the hospital whether or not the individual is in a specialized ward and whether or not the individual remains in the hospital for lack of suitable placement elsewhere.

- 6) "Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rate" means a fraction, the numerator of which is the Medicaid (Title XIX) obstetrical inpatient days, as defined in subsection (k)(7) of this Section, provided by a Medicaid-participating Illinois hospital providing obstetrical services to patients who, for such days, were eligible for Medicaid under Title XIX of the ~~Federal federal~~ Social Security Act (42 USC 1396a et seq.), and the denominator of which is the total Medicaid (Title XIX) inpatient days, as defined in subsection (k)(9) of this Section provided by such hospital. This information shall be derived from claims for applicable services provided in the Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rate base year which were subsequently adjudicated by the Department through the last day of June preceding the DSH determination year and contained within the Department's paid claims data base.
- 7) "Medicaid (Title XIX) obstetrical inpatient days" means hospital inpatient days which were subsequently adjudicated by the Department through the last day of June preceding the DSH determination year and contained within the Department's paid claims data base, for recipients of medical assistance under Title XIX of the Social Security Act, with a Diagnosis Related Group (DRG) of 370 through 375, an ICD-9-CM principal diagnosis code of 640.0 through 648.9 with a 5th digit of 1 or 2; 650; 651.0 through 659.9 with a 5th digit of 1, 2, 3, or 4; 660.0 through 669.9 with a 5th digit of 1, 2, 3, or 4; 670.0 through 676.9 with a 5th digit of 1 or 2; or V27 through V27.9; or V30 through V39.9; or any ICD-9-CM principal diagnosis code that is accompanied with a surgery procedure code between 72 and 75.99; and specifically excludes Medicare/Medicaid crossover claims.
- 8) "Statewide average hospital payment rate" means the hospital's alternative reimbursement rate, as defined in Section 148.270(a).
- 9) "Total Medicaid (Title XIX) inpatient days", as referred to in subsections

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(k)(4) and (k)(6) of this Section, means hospital inpatient days, excluding days for normal newborns, which were subsequently adjudicated by the Department through the last day of June preceding the DSH determination year and contained within the Department's paid claims data base, for recipients of medical assistance under Title XIX of the Social Security Act, and specifically excludes Medicare/Medicaid crossover claims.

- 10) "Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rate base year" means, for example, fiscal year 1992 for the October 1, 1993, DSH determination year; fiscal year 1993 for the October 1, 1994, DSH determination year, etc.

**Section 148.310 Review Procedure**

- a) Inpatient Rate Reviews
- 1) Hospitals shall be notified of their inpatient rate for the rate year and shall have an opportunity to request a review of any rate for errors in calculation made by the Department. Such a request must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of their rates. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review. \
  - 2) Hospitals reimbursed in accordance with Sections 148.250 through 148.300 and 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149 with respect to per diem add-ons for capital may request that an adjustment be made to their base year costs to reflect significant changes in costs which have been mandated in order to meet State, federal or local health and safety standards, and which have occurred since the hospital's filing of the base year cost report. The allowable Medicare/Medicaid costs must be identified from the most recent audited cost report available. These costs must be significant, i.e., on a per unit basis, they must constitute one percent or more of the total allowable Medicaid/Medicare unit costs for the same time period. Appeals for base year cost adjustments must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of their rates. Such request shall include a clear explanation of the cost change and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.

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- b) DSH Determination Reviews
- 1) Hospitals shall be notified of their qualification for DSH payment adjustments and shall have an opportunity to request a review of the DSH add-on for errors in calculation made by the Department. Such a request must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its disproportionate share qualification and add-on calculations. Such request shall include a clear explanation of the error and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
  - 2) DSH determination reviews shall be limited to the following:
    - A) DSH Determination Criteria. The criteria for DSH determination shall be in accordance with Section 148.120. Review shall be limited to verification that the Department utilized criteria in accordance with State regulations.
    - B) Medicaid Inpatient Utilization Rates
      - i) Medicaid inpatient utilization rates shall be calculated pursuant to Section 1923 of the Social Security Act and as defined in Section 148.120(k)(5). Review shall be limited to verification that Medicaid inpatient utilization rates were calculated in accordance with federal and State regulations.
      - ii) Hospitals' Medicaid inpatient utilization rates, as defined in Section 148.120(k)(5), which have been derived from unaudited cost reports or HDSC forms, are not subject to the Review Procedure with the exception of errors in calculation by the Department. Pursuant to Section 148.120(c)(1)(B) and (c)(1)(C)(i) and (ii), hospitals shall have the opportunity to submit corrected information prior to the Department's final DSH determination.
    - C) Low Income Utilization Rates. Low Income utilization rates shall be calculated in accordance with Section 1923 of the Social Security Act and Section 148.120(a)(2) and (d). Review shall be limited to verification that low income utilization rates were calculated in accordance with federal and State regulations.
    - D) Federally Designated Health Manpower Shortage Areas (HMSAs). Illinois hospitals located in federally designated HMSAs shall be identified in accordance with 42 CFR 5, 1989, and Section 148.120(a)(3) based upon the methodologies utilized by, and the most current information available to the Department from the

Department of Health and Human Services as of June 30, 1992.

Review shall be limited to hospitals in locations that have failed to obtain designation as federally designated HMSAs only when such a request for review is accompanied by documentation from the Department of Health and Human Services substantiating that the hospital was located in a federally designated HMSA as of June 30, 1992.

- E) Excess Beds. Excess bed information shall be determined in accordance with Public Act 86-268 (Code Section 148.120(a)(3) and 77 Ill. Adm. Code 1100) based upon the methodologies utilized by, and the most current information available to, the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Board as of July 1, 1991. Reviews shall be limited to requests accompanied by documentation from the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Board substantiating that the information supplied to and utilized by the Department was incorrect.
  - F) Medicaid Obstetrical Inpatient Utilization Rates. Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rates shall be calculated in accordance with Section 148.120(a)(4), (k)(4), (k)(6) and (k)(7). Review shall be limited to verification that Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rates were calculated in accordance with State regulations.
- c) Outlier Adjustment Reviews
- The Department shall make outlier adjustments to payment amounts in accordance with 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.105 or Section 148.130, whichever is applicable. Hospitals shall be notified of the specific information which shall be utilized in the determination of those services qualified for an outlier adjustment and shall have an opportunity to request a review of such specific information for errors in calculation made by the Department. Such a request must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of the specific information which shall be utilized in the determination of those services qualified for an outlier adjustment. Such request shall include a clear explanation of the error and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- d) Cost Report Reviews
- 1) Cost reports are required from:
    - A) All enrolled hospitals within the State of Illinois;
    - B) All out-of-state hospitals providing 100 inpatient days of service

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- per hospital fiscal year, to persons covered by the Illinois Medical Assistance Program; and
- C) All hospitals not located in Illinois that elect to be reimbursed under the methodology described in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149 (the DRG PPS).
- 2) The completed cost statement with a copy of the hospital's Medicare cost report and audited financial statement must be submitted annually within 90 days of the close of the hospital's fiscal year. A one-time 30-day extension may be requested. Such a request for an extension shall be in writing and shall be received by the Department's Office of Health Finance prior to the end of the 90-day filing period. The Office of Health Finance shall audit the information shown on the Hospital Statement of Reimbursable Cost and Support Schedules. The audit shall be made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and shall include tests of the accounting and statistical records and applicable auditing procedures. Hospitals shall be notified of the results of the final audited cost report which may contain adjustments and revisions which may have resulted from the audited Medicare Cost Report. Hospitals shall have the opportunity to request a review of the final audited cost report. Such a request must be received in writing by the Department within 45 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of the results of the finalized audit. Such request shall include all items of documentation and analysis which support the request for review. No additional data shall be accepted after the 45 day period. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- e) Trauma Center Adjustment Reviews
- 1) The Department shall make trauma care adjustments in accordance with Section 148.290(c). Hospitals shall have the right to appeal the trauma center adjustment calculations if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department.
- 2) Trauma level designation is obtained from the Illinois Department of Public Health as of the first day of July preceding the trauma center adjustment rate period. Review shall be limited to requests accompanied by documentation from the Illinois Department of Public Health, or the licensing agency in the state in which the hospital is located, substantiating that the information supplied to and utilized by the Department was incorrect.
- 3) Appeals under this subsection (e) must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the

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date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification for trauma center adjustments and payment amounts. Such a request shall include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.

- f) **Medicaid High Volume Adjustment Reviews**  
The Department shall make Medicaid high volume adjustments in accordance with Section 148.290(d). Review shall be limited to verification that the Medicaid inpatient days were calculated in accordance with State regulations. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification for Medicaid high volume adjustments and payment amounts. Such a request shall include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- g) **Sole Community Hospital Designation Reviews**  
The Department shall make sole community hospital designations in accordance with 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.125(b). Hospitals shall have the right to appeal the designation if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the determination. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after notification of the designation. Such a request shall include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review no later than 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- h) **Geographic Designation Reviews**
  - 1) The Department shall make rural hospital designations in accordance with Section 148.25(g)(3). Hospitals shall have the right to appeal the designation if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the determination. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notification of the designation. Such a request shall include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review no later than 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
  - 2) The Department shall make urban hospital designations in accordance with Section 148.25(g)(4). Hospitals shall have the right to appeal the

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designation if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the determination. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notification of the designation. Such a request shall include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review no later than 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.

- i) Critical Hospital Adjustment Payment (CHAP) Reviews
  - 1) The Department shall make CHAP payments in accordance with Section 148.295. Hospitals shall be notified in writing of the results of the CHAP determination and calculation, and shall have the right to appeal the CHAP calculation or their ineligibility for the CHAP if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification for CHAP and payment adjustment amounts, or a letter of notification that the hospital does not qualify for the CHAP. Such a request shall include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
  - 2) CHAP determination reviews shall be limited to the following:
    - A) Federally Designated Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs). Illinois hospitals located in federally designated HPSAs shall be identified in accordance with 42 CFR 5, and Section 148.295(a)(3)(B) and (b)(3) based upon the methodologies utilized by, and the most current information available to, the Department from the Department of Health and Human Services as of the last day of June preceding the CHAP rate period. Review shall be limited to hospitals in locations that have failed to obtain designation as federally designated HPSAs only when such a request for review is accompanied by documentation from the Department of Health and Human Services substantiating that the hospital was located in a federally designated HPSA as of the last day of June preceding the CHAP rate period.
    - B) Trauma level designation. Trauma level designation is obtained from the Illinois Department of Public Health as of the last day of June preceding the CHAP rate period. Review shall be limited to requests accompanied by documentation from the Illinois

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- Department of Public Health, substantiating that the information supplied to and utilized by the Department was incorrect.
- C) Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities. Accreditation of rehabilitation facilities shall be obtained from the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities as of the last day of June preceding the CHAP rate period. Review shall be limited to requests accompanied by documentation from the Commission, substantiating that the information supplied to and utilized by the Department was incorrect.
  - D) Medicaid Inpatient Utilization Rates. Medicaid inpatient utilization rates shall be calculated pursuant to Section 1923 of the Social Security Act and as defined in Section 148.120(k)(5). Review shall be limited to verification that Medicaid inpatient utilization rates were calculated in accordance with federal and State regulations.
  - E) Graduate Medical Education Programs. Graduate Medical Education program information shall be obtained from the most recently published report of the American Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education, the American Osteopathic Association Division of Post-doctoral Training, or the American Dental Association Joint Commission on Dental Accreditation as of the last day of June preceding the CHAP rate period. Review shall be limited to requests accompanied by documentation from the above, substantiating that the information supplied to and utilized by the Department was incorrect.
- j) Tertiary Care Adjustment Payment Reviews. The Department shall make Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments in accordance with Section 148.296. Hospitals shall be notified in writing of the results of the Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments determination and calculation, and shall have the right to appeal the Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments calculation or their ineligibility for Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification for Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments and payment adjustment amounts, or a letter of notification that the hospital does not qualify for Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments. Such a request must include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation that supports the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.

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- k) Pediatric Outpatient Adjustment Payments. The Department shall make Pediatric Outpatient Adjustment payments in accordance with Section 148.297. Hospitals shall be notified in writing of the results of the determination and calculation, and shall have the right to appeal the calculation or their ineligibility for payments under Section 148.297 if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification under Section 148.297 and payment adjustment amounts, or a letter of notification that the hospital does not qualify for such payments. Such a request must include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation that supports the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- l) Pediatric Inpatient Adjustment Payments. The Department shall make Pediatric Inpatient Adjustment payments in accordance with Section 148.298. Hospitals shall be notified in writing of the results of the determination and calculation, and shall have the right to appeal the calculation or their ineligibility for payments under Section 148.298 if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification under Section 148.298 and payment adjustment amounts, or a letter of notification that the hospital does not qualify for such payments. Such a request must include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation that supports the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- m) For purposes of this Section, the term "post marked" means the date of processing by the United States Post Office or any independent carrier service.
- n) The review procedures provided for in this Section may not be used to submit any new or corrected information that was required to be submitted by a specific date in order to qualify for a payment or payment adjustment. In addition, only information that was submitted expressly for the purpose of qualifying for the payment or payment adjustment under review shall be considered by the Department. Information that has been submitted to the Department for other purposes will not be considered during the review process.

    - A) The outline shall indicate the number of hours that will be dedicated to each component of the training program. This outline shall not preclude the instructor from varying the order of presentation of the outlined course components.
    - B) The outline shall address each of the required curricula content requirements contained in Section 395.300 (Basic Nursing Assistant Training Program), Section 395.310 (Developmental Disabilities Aides Training Program), or Section 395.320 (Basic

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Child Care/Habilitation Aide Training Program) or Section 395.330 (Psychiatric Rehabilitation Services Aide Training Program).

- 5) A master schedule for the training program, which includes at least the following:
  - A) The location, classroom designation, and scheduled dates of the training program.
  - B) The allocation of the daily and total hours of instruction between theory and clinical instruction.
  - C) Identification of theory and clinical ~~instructors~~ ~~instructor(s)~~ and approved evaluator, and whether the instruction is theory or clinical.
  - D) Curriculum Coordinator, for developmental disabilities aide training programs.
- 6) Resumes describing the education, experience, and qualifications of each program instructor including a copy of any valid Illinois licenses, as applicable.
- 7) Any clinical site agreements for the use of facilities and equipment that are not owned or operated by the program sponsor. Such agreements shall be signed by the owner or operator of the facilities or equipment and shall include the dates such facilities or equipment will be used, and a description of the classrooms, laboratory, clinical training equipment, and any other facilities or equipment that will be used in the program.
- 8) A copy or a description of the tools that will be used to evaluate the following aspects of the training program:
  - A) Training program objectives and instructors.
  - B) Training program content.
  - C) Clinical performance, encompassing all skills taught, and for a Basic Nursing Assistant Training Program, the State-approved manual skills evaluation developed from the curriculum outlined in Section 395.300.

SUBPART H: REGISTRATION OF DEALERS, SALESPERSONS, ~~AND~~ INVESTMENT

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ADVISERS AND INVESTMENT ADVISER REPRESENTATIVES**Section 130.805 Exemptions From Registration as an Investment Adviser Under Section 8.A of the Act**

The Secretary pursuant to Section 8.A of the Act hereby exempts from registration as an investment adviser:

- a) any investment adviser whose only clients in this State are any one or more of the following, whether acting on their own behalf or in some fiduciary capacity:
  - 1) investment companies as defined in the Federal 1940 Investment Company Act, as defined in Section 130.200 of this Part;
  - 2) employee pension or profit-sharing plans or trusts having total assets of not less than \$5,000,000;
  - 3) governments and governmental agencies or instrumentalities, and whether acting for itself or as a trustee with investment control; or
  - 4) banks, savings banks, savings institutions, trust companies, insurance companies, building and loan associations and other financial institutions or institutional investors, and any other persons to whom an offer, sale or issuance of a security would be exempt pursuant to Section 4.C, 4.D or 4.H of the Act, provided that such persons maintain a net worth of not less than \$1,000,000; and
- b) any investment adviser or federal covered investment adviser who during the immediately preceding twelve consecutive months has not had more than five clients in this State in addition to clients of the types specified in subsection (a) of this Section, whether or not such investment adviser or federal covered investment adviser is then present in this State.

**Section 130.836 Hardship Exemption**

- a) Temporary hardship exemption.
  - 1) Investment advisers registered or required to be registered under the Act who experience unanticipated technical difficulties that prevent submission of an electronic filing to IARD may request a temporary hardship exemption from the requirements to file electronically.
  - 2) To apply for a temporary hardship exemption, the investment adviser shall file a written request utilizing Form ADV-H with the securities administrator in the state where the investment adviser's principal place of business is located. The request shall be submitted in a form approved by

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- the securities administrator, and it shall be filed no later than one business day after the due date for the filing that is the subject of the request. The investment adviser shall also submit the filing that is the subject of the request in electronic format to IARD no later than seven business days after the filing was due.
- 3) If the request is in proper form, the temporary hardship exemption shall be deemed effective upon receipt by the securities administrator. Multiple temporary hardship exemption requests within the same calendar year may be disallowed by the Securities Department.
- b) Continuing hardship exemption.
- 1) A continuing hardship exemption shall be granted only if the investment adviser is able to demonstrate that the electronic filing requirements of this regulation are prohibitively burdensome.
- 2) To apply for a continuing hardship exemption, the investment adviser shall file a written request utilizing Form ADV-H with the securities administrator in the state where the investment adviser's principal place of business is located. The request shall be submitted in a form approved by the securities commissioner, and it shall be filed no later than 20 business days before the due date for the filing that is the subject of the request. If the investment adviser's principal place of business is located in Illinois, the request shall be either granted or denied by the Securities Department within 10 business days after the filing of the request.
- 3) The exemption shall be effective upon approval by the securities administrator in the state where the investment adviser's principal place of business is located. The time period of the exemption shall be no longer than one year after the date on which the request is filed. If the securities administrator approves the request, the investment adviser shall, no later than five business days after the exemption approval date, submit filings to the IARD in paper form, along with the appropriate processing fees, for the period of time for which the exemption is granted.
- c) The decision to grant or deny a request for a hardship exemption shall be made by the securities administrator in the state where the investment adviser's principal place of business is located, and the decision shall be adhered to by the Securities Department.

- b) For purposes of annual notification filing, a federal covered investment adviser shall file with the NASD, utilizing the IARD Securities Department the Annual Notification filing form and Schedule I to Form ADV, or copies of page 1 of the most recent Form ADV, Schedule E and Schedule I to Form ADV. The federal covered investment adviser shall also pay the filing fee specified in Section 130.110 of this Part.
- c) Amendments to ~~page 1 of~~ Form ADV shall be filed with the NASD, utilizing the IARD, Securities Department at the same time they are filed with the SEC.
- d) In the event the federal covered investment adviser changes the form of its organization it shall pay the fee specified in Section 130.110 of this Part.
- e) A federal covered investment adviser that is no longer eligible for SEC registration shall file an amendment Schedule I to Form ADV with the SEC and the NASD, utilizing the IARD, indicating it is no longer eligible for SEC registration.
- f) In the event the notification or the full amount of fees required by this Section is not filed with or paid to the Secretary of State, the Secretary of State shall notify the federal covered investment adviser of such deficiency in writing, or by facsimile or electronic transmission (provided that the Securities Department can demonstrate in the normal course of its business that the notice was delivered or transmitted to and received by the federal covered investment adviser or its designee). In the event the federal covered investment adviser fails to remedy the

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deficiency within ten business days after receiving notice of such deficiency from the Secretary of State, the Secretary of State may deem such as a refusal and ~~may, until October 11, 1999,~~ require the federal covered investment adviser to register pursuant to subsections A and D of Section 8 of the Act.

Maryland has reported great environmental damage caused by snakehead fishes with populations becoming established. Because of the natural history of these fishes, their tolerance to a wide range of environmental conditions, high fecundity, and aggressive invasive nature, it is of utmost importance that immediate action be taken to preserve and protect our aquatic resources from the potentially devastating effects of these invaders. Regulations to prevent snakeheads from entering Illinois via the aquarium industry, and regulations to reduce the potential for the release and spread of these organisms in Illinois are necessary immediately.

  - Snakeheads transport parasites and other fish diseases, and the effects of these on our native fish populations is unknown;
  - Threatened and endangered species of fish, amphibians, and mollusks would likely suffer negative impacts; and
  - The impact upon IDNR operations and budget could be great, with large manpower and monetary demands for surveillance and response programs.

The IDNR shares responsibility with the Department of Agriculture (DOA) for the regulation of aquarium fish species. This amendment implements regulations to minimize the threat of snakehead fishes entering Illinois waters through aquaculture, transportation, unintentional release, or release of unwanted, oversize fish by aquarium owners. This language will complement the DOA's regulations under the Animal Welfare Act (225 ILCS 605) and the proposed rule from USFWS listing all species of snakeheads (family *Channidae*) as injurious under the federal Lacey Act.

The SLF project began in 1998 and currently, there are 15 operational SLFs in Illinois which provide residential services for approximately 370 Medicaid residents. Rates paid for SLF services are set at 60 percent of the weighted average NF rate, based upon the geographic group in which it is located. The rates are reviewed annually and necessary adjustments are effective on October 1.

SLFs shall accept the reimbursement provided in this Section as payment in full for all services provided to Medicaid residents.

- a) ~~Unless otherwise established by contract, SLFs shall be reimbursed according to this Section.~~ The Department shall establish its portion of the reimbursement for Medicaid residents by calculating 60 percent of the weighted average (weighted by Medicaid patient days) nursing facility rates for the geographic grouping as defined in Section 146.290. Each SLF shall be paid 60 percent of the weighted average nursing facility geographic group rate, based upon the nursing facility geographic group in which it is located. The rates paid to SLFs shall be reviewed annually, and adjusted, if necessary, on October 1 to assure that the rates coincide with 60 percent of weighted average nursing facility geographic group rates. Effective October 1, 2002, SLF rates shall remain at a minimum of the rate in effect as of September 30, 2002.
- b) The payment rate received by the SLF from the Department for services, with the exception of meals, provided in accordance with Section 146.230 shall constitute the full and complete charge for services rendered. Additional payment, other than patient credits authorized by the Department, may not be accepted. Meals are included in the room and board amount paid by the resident.
- c) Single Occupancy: Each Medicaid resident of an SLF shall be allotted \$90 per month as a deduction from his or her income as a protected amount for personal use. The SLF may charge each Medicaid resident no more than the current SSI rate for a single individual less \$90 for room and board charges. Any income

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remaining after deduction of the protected \$90 and room and board charges shall be applied first towards medical expenses not covered under the Department's Medical Assistance Program. Any income remaining after that shall be applied to the charges for SLF services paid by the Department.

- d) Double Occupancy: In the event a Medicaid eligible resident chooses to share an apartment, the Medicaid resident of an SLF shall be allotted \$90 per month as a deduction from his or her income as a protected amount for personal use. The SLF may charge each Medicaid resident no more than the resident's share of the current SSI rate for a couple less \$90 for room and board charges. The room and board rate for two Medicaid eligible individuals sharing an apartment cannot exceed the SSI rate for a married couple even if the two individuals sharing an apartment are unrelated. Any income of an individual remaining after deduction of the protected \$90 and room and board charges shall be applied first towards that individual's medical expenses not covered under the Department's Medical Assistance Program. Any income of an individual remaining after that shall be applied to that individual's charges for SLF services paid by the Department. If one, or both, of the individuals sharing an apartment is not Medicaid eligible, the SLF ~~may is free to~~ negotiate its own rate with the non-Medicaid individual or individuals.
- e) The room and board charge for Medicaid residents shall only be increased when the SSI amount is increased. Any room and board charge increase shall not exceed the amount of the SSI increase.
- f) Payment shall be made by the Department for up to 30 days per State fiscal year during a Medicaid resident's temporary absence from the SLF when the absence is due to situations including but not limited to hospitalization or vacation. The resident shall continue to be responsible for room and board charges during any absence. Refer to Section 146.255(b) and (d)(7) for involuntary discharge criteria relating to temporary absence. Nursing facilities that have a distinct part certified as an SLF shall not consider converted beds in the nursing facility's licensed capacity when calculating the 93 percent occupancy level for bed reserve payment pursuant to 89 Ill. The new Psychiatric Adjustment Payments program is designed to ensure access to essential psychiatric services, particularly for clients who live in downstate Illinois. a) Qualifying Criteria

Psychiatric Adjustment Payments shall be made to a qualifying hospital, as defined in this subsection (a). A hospital not otherwise excluded under subsection (b) of this Section shall qualify for payment if it meets one of the following criteria as of July 1, 2002:

- 1) The hospital is located in Illinois; is a general acute care hospital with a distinct part unit as defined in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(d)(1) enrolled with the Department to provide inpatient psychiatric services; has a current psychiatric care per diem rate less than the statewide psychiatric distinct part unit average default rate; is located outside of HSA 6; and has a MIUR as described in subsection (e)(5) of this Section that is greater than 60 percent.
- 2) The hospital is located in Illinois; is a general acute care hospital with a distinct part unit as defined in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(d)(1) enrolled with the Department to provide inpatient psychiatric services; has a current psychiatric care per diem rate less than the statewide psychiatric distinct part unit average default rate; is located outside of HSA 6; has a MIUR as described in subsection (e)(5) that is greater than 20 percent; has greater than 325 total licensed beds as described in subsection (e)(2) of this Section; and has a psychiatric occupancy rate described in subsection (e)(4) of this Section that is greater than 50 percent.
- 3) The hospital is located in Illinois; is a general acute care hospital with a distinct part unit as defined in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(d)(1) enrolled with the Department to provide inpatient psychiatric services; has a current psychiatric care per diem rate less than the statewide psychiatric

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- distinct part unit average default rate; is located outside of HSA 6; has a MIUR as described in subsection (e)(5) of this Section that is greater than 15 percent; has greater than 500 total licensed beds as described in subsection (e)(2) of this Section; has a psychiatric occupancy rate as described in subsection (e)(4) of this Section that is greater than 35 percent; and has total licensed psychiatric beds described in subsection (e)(3) of this Section that is greater than 50.
- 4) The hospital is located in Illinois; is a general acute care hospital with a distinct part unit as defined in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(d)(1) enrolled with the Department to provide inpatient psychiatric services; has a current psychiatric care per diem rate less than the statewide psychiatric distinct part unit average default rate; is located outside of HSA 6; has a MIUR as described in subsection (e)(5) of this Section that is greater than 19 percent; has less than 275 total licensed beds as described in subsection (e)(2) of this Section; has fewer than 1,000 total psychiatric care days as described in subsection (e)(8) of this Section; has 40 or fewer total licensed psychiatric beds as described in subsection (e)(3) of this Section; has greater than 6,000 total days as described in subsection (e)(9) of this Section.
- b) The following five classes of hospitals are ineligible for Psychiatric Adjustment Payments associated with the qualifying criteria listed in subsections (a)(1) through (a)(4) of this Section:
- 1) Hospitals located outside of Illinois.
  - 2) Hospitals located inside HSA 6.
  - 3) Psychiatric hospitals, as described in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(c)(1).
  - 4) Long term stay hospitals, as described in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(c)(4).
  - 5) A children's hospital, as described in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(c)(3).
- c) Psychiatric Adjustment Payment Rates
- 1) For a hospital qualifying under subsection (a)(1) of this Section, the rate is \$63.00.
  - 2) For a hospital qualifying under subsection (a)(2) of this Section that:
    - A) Has less than 10,000 total days, the rate is \$78.00.
    - B) Has equal to or greater than 10,000 total days, the rate is \$125.00.
  - 3) For a hospital qualifying under subsection (a)(3) of this Section, the rate is \$21.00.
  - 4) For a hospital qualifying under subsection (a)(4) of this Section, the rate is \$38.00.
- d) Payment to a Qualifying Hospital
- 1) The total annual adjustment amount to a qualifying hospital shall be the product of the appropriate psychiatric adjustment payment rate, as

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described in subsection (c) of this Section, multiplied by total days as described in subsection (e)(9) of this Section.

- 2) The total annual adjustment amount shall be paid to the hospital during the Psychiatric Adjustment Payment period in installments on, at least, a quarterly basis.

e) Definitions

- 1) “HSA” means Health Service Area, as defined by the Illinois Department of Public Health.
- 2) “Total licensed beds” means, for a given hospital, the number of licensed beds, excluding long term care and substance abuse beds, as listed in the July 25, 2001, Illinois Department of Public Health report entitled “Percent Occupancy by Service in Year 2000 for Short Stay, Non-Federal Hospitals in Illinois”.
- 3) “Licensed psychiatric beds” means, for a given hospital, the number of psychiatric licensed beds, as listed in the July 25, 2001, Illinois Department of Public Health report entitled “Percent Occupancy by Service in Year 2000 for Short Stay, Non-Federal Hospitals in Illinois”.
- 4) “Psychiatric occupancy rate” means, for a given hospital, the psychiatric hospital occupancy rate as listed in the July 25, 2001, Illinois Department of Public Health report entitled “Percent Occupancy by Service in Year 2000 for Short Stay, Non-Federal Hospitals in Illinois”.
- 5) “MIUR” for a given hospital, has the meaning as defined in Section 148.120(k)(5), and shall be determined in accordance with Sections 148.120(c) and (f). For purposes of this rulemaking, the MIUR determination that was used to determine a hospital's eligibility for Disproportionate Share Hospital Adjustment Payments in rate year 2002 shall be the same determination used to determine a hospital's eligibility for Psychiatric Adjustment Payments in the Psychiatric Adjustment Payment Period.
- 6) “Psychiatric Adjustment Payment base year” means the 12-month period beginning on July 1, 2000, and ending on June 30, 2001.
- 7) “Psychiatric Adjustment Payment period” means, beginning October 1, 2002, the nine month period beginning October 1 and ending June 30 of the following year, and beginning July 1, 2003, the 12 month period beginning July 1 of the year and ending June 30 of the following year.
- 8) “Total psychiatric care days” means, for a given hospital, the sum of days of inpatient psychiatric care, as defined in Section 148.40(a), provided to recipients of medical assistance under Title XIX of the federal Social Security Act, excluding days for individuals eligible for Medicare under Title XVIII of that Act (Medicaid/Medicare crossover days), as tabulated

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from the Department's claims data for admissions occurring in the psychiatric adjustment payment base year that were adjudicated by the Department through June 30, 2001.

- 9) "Total days" means, for a given hospital, the sum of days of inpatient hospital services provided to recipients of medical assistance under Title XIX of the federal Social Security Act, excluding days for individuals eligible for Medicare under Title XVIII of that Act (Medicaid/Medicare crossover days), as tabulated from the Department's claims data for admissions occurring in the psychiatric adjustment payment base year that were adjudicated by the Department through June 30, 2001.
- 10) "Psychiatric care average length of stay" means the quotient, the numerator of which is the number of psychiatric care days in the Psychiatric Adjustment Payment base year, the denominator of which is the number of admissions in the Psychiatric Adjustment Payment base year.

**Section 148.115 Rural Adjustment Payments**  
**EMERGENCY**

- a) Qualifying Criteria  
Rural Adjustment Payments shall be made to all qualifying general acute care hospitals that are designated as a Critical Access Hospital or a Necessary Provider, as designated by the Illinois Department of Public Health, in accordance with 42 CFR 485, Subpart F (2001), as of the first day of July in the Rural Adjustment Payment rate period.
- b) Rural Adjustment Rates
- 1) Inpatient Component  
For a hospital qualifying under subsection (a) of this Section, a Rural Adjustment Payment inpatient component shall be calculated as follows:
- A) Total inpatient payments, as described in subsection (d)(2) of this Section, shall be divided by the total inpatient days, as described in subsection (d)(4) of this Section, to derive an inpatient payment per day.
- B) Total inpatient charges, associated with inpatient days as described in subsection (d)(4) of this Section, shall be multiplied by the hospital's cost to charge ratio, as described in subsection (d)(1) of this Section, to derive total inpatient cost.

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- C) Total inpatient costs, as defined in subsection (b)(1)(B) of this Section, are divided by the total inpatient days, as described in subsection (d)(4) of this Section, to derive an inpatient cost per day.
- D) Inpatient payment per day, as defined in subsection (b)(1)(A) of this Section, shall be subtracted from the inpatient cost per day, as described in subsection (b)(1)(C) of this Section, to derive an inpatient cost coverage deficit per day. The minimum result shall be no lower than zero.
- E) Inpatient cost coverage deficit per day, as described in subsection (b)(1)(D) of this Section, shall be multiplied by the total inpatient days, as described in subsection (d)(4) of this Section, to derive a total hospital specific inpatient cost coverage deficit.
- F) The inpatient cost deficits, as described in subsection (b)(1)(E) of this Section, for all qualifying hospitals, shall be summed to determine an aggregate Rural Adjustment Payment base year inpatient cost deficit.

2) Outpatient Component

For a hospital qualifying under subsection (a) of this Section, a Rural Adjustment Payment outpatient component shall be calculated as follows:

- A) Total outpatient payments, as defined in subsection (d)(3) of this Section, shall be divided by the total outpatient services, as described in subsection (d)(5) of this Section, to derive an outpatient payment per service unit.
- B) Total outpatient charges, associated with outpatient services, as defined in subsection (d)(5) of this Section, shall be multiplied by the hospital's cost to charge ratio, as described in subsection (d)(1) of this Section, to derive total outpatient cost.
- C) Total outpatient costs, as defined in subsection (b)(2)(B) of this Section, are divided by the total outpatient services, as described in subsection (d)(5) of this Section, to derive an outpatient cost per service unit.
- D) Outpatient payment per service unit, as defined in subsection (b)(2)(A) of this Section, shall be subtracted from the outpatient cost per service unit, as described in subsection (b)(2)(C) of this Section, to derive an outpatient cost coverage deficit per service unit. The minimum result shall be no lower than zero.
- E) Outpatient cost coverage deficit per service unit, as described in subsection (b)(2)(D) of this Section, shall be multiplied by the total outpatient services, as described in subsection (d)(5) of this

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Section, to derive a total hospital specific outpatient cost coverage deficit.

F) The outpatient cost coverage deficits, as described in subsection (b)(2)(e) of this Section, for all qualifying hospitals, shall be summed to determine an aggregate Rural Adjustment Payment base year outpatient cost deficit.

3) Payment Methodology

A \$7 million total pool shall be allocated to the program, and proportioned between inpatient services and outpatient services as follows:

A) The total inpatient cost coverage deficit, as described in subsection (b)(1)(F) of this Section, is added to the total outpatient cost coverage deficit, as described in subsection (b)(2)(F) of this Section, to derive a total Rural Adjustment Payment base year deficit.

B) The inpatient pool allocation percentage shall be the quotient, the numerator of which is the total inpatient cost deficit, as described in subsection (b)(1)(F) of this Section, the denominator of which is the total Rural Adjustment Payment base year deficit, as described in subsection (b)(3)(A) of this Section.

C) The outpatient pool allocation percentage shall be the quotient, the numerator of which is the total outpatient cost deficit, as described in subsection (b)(2)(F) of this Section, the denominator of which is the total Rural Adjustment Payment base year deficit, as described in (b)(3)(A) of this Section.

D) An inpatient pool allocation shall be the product of the inpatient pool allocation percentage, as described in subsection (b)(3)(B) of this Section, multiplied by the \$7 million pool, as described in subsection (b)(3) of this Section.

E) The outpatient pool allocation shall be the product of the outpatient pool allocation percentage, as described in subsection (b)(3)(C) of this Section, multiplied by the \$7 million pool, as described in subsection (b)(3) of this Section.

F) An inpatient residual cost coverage factor shall be the quotient, the numerator of which shall be the inpatient pool allocation, as described in subsection (b)(3)(D) of this Section, the denominator of which shall be the total inpatient cost deficit as described in subsection (b)(1)(F) of this Section.

G) An outpatient residual cost coverage factor shall be the quotient, the numerator of which shall be the outpatient pool allocation, as described in subsection (b)(3)(E) of this Section, the denominator

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- of which shall be the total outpatient cost deficit as described in subsection (b)(2)(F) of this Section.
- H) The hospital specific inpatient cost coverage adjustment amount shall be the product of the inpatient residual cost coverage factor, as described in subsection (b)(3)(F) of this Section, multiplied by the hospital specific inpatient cost coverage deficit, as described in subsection (b)(1)(E) of this Section.
- I) The hospital specific outpatient cost coverage adjustment amount shall be the product of the outpatient residual cost coverage factor, as described in subsection (b)(3)(G) of this Section, multiplied by the hospital specific outpatient cost coverage deficit, as described in subsection (b)(2)(E) of this Section.
- c) Payment to a Qualifying Hospital
- 1) The total annual adjustment amount to a qualified hospital shall be the sum of the hospital specific inpatient cost coverage adjustment amount, as described in subsection (b)(3)(H) of this Section, plus the hospital specific outpatient cost coverage adjustment amount, as described in subsection (b)(3)(I) of this Section.
- 2) The total annual adjustment amount shall be paid to the hospital during the Rural Adjustment Payment rate period, as described in subsection (d)(7) of this Section, on at least a quarterly basis.
- d) Definitions.
- 1) "Hospital cost to charge ratio", means the quotient, the numerator of which is the cost as reported on Form HCFA 2552, worksheet C, Part 1, column 1, row 101, the denominator of which is the charges as reported on Form HCFA 2552, worksheet C, Part 1, column 8, row 101. The base year for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2003 shall be the hospital's fiscal year 1999 Medicare cost report, and, for SFY 2004, the hospital's fiscal year 2000 cost report shall be utilized. The base year for any SFY shall be determined in this manner.
- 2) "Inpatient payments", shall mean all payments associated with total days provided, as described in subsection (d)(4) of this Section, and all quarterly adjustment payments paid, as described throughout Part 148.
- 3) "Outpatient payments", shall mean all payments associated with total outpatient services provided, as described in subsection (d)(5) of this Section, and all quarterly adjustment payments paid, as described in this Part.
- 4) "Total days" means, for a given hospital, the sum of days of inpatient hospital service provided to recipients of medical assistance under Title XIX of the federal Social Security Act, excluding days for individuals

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- eligible for Medicare under Title XVIII of that Act (Medicaid/Medicare crossover days), as tabulated from the Department's claims data for admissions occurring in the Rural Adjustment Payment base year that were subsequently adjudicated through the last day of June preceding the Rural Adjustment Payment rate period.
- 5) "Total outpatient services" means the number of outpatient services provided during the Rural Adjustment Payment Base Year, to recipients of medical assistance under Title XIX of the federal Social Security Act, excluding services for individuals eligible for Medicare under Title XVIII of that Act (Medicaid/Medicare crossover days), as tabulated from the Department's claims data for services occurring in the Rural Adjustment Payment base year that were subsequently adjudicated through the last day of June preceding the Rural Adjustment Payment rate period.
- 6) "Rural Adjustment Payment base year" means, for the Rural Adjustment Payment rate period beginning October 1, 2002, State fiscal year 2001; for the Rural Adjustment Payment rate period beginning July 1, 2003, State fiscal year 2002. The Rural Adjustment Payment base year for subsequent rate periods shall be determined in this manner.
- 7) "Rural Adjustment Payment rate period" means, beginning October 1, 2002, the nine month period beginning October 1 and ending June 30 of the following year, and beginning July 1, 2003, the 12 month period beginning July 1 of that year and ending June 30 of the following year.

Critical Hospital Adjustment Payments (CHAP) shall be made to all eligible hospitals excluding county-owned hospitals, as described in Section 148.25(b)(1)(A), unless otherwise noted in this Section, and hospitals organized under the University of Illinois Hospital Act, as described in Section 148.25(b)(1)(B), for inpatient admissions occurring on or after July 1, 1998, in accordance with this Section. ~~The provisions described in this Section will be effective through June 30, 2002.~~

- a) Trauma Center Adjustments (TCA)  
The Department shall make a trauma center adjustment (TCA) to Illinois hospitals recognized, as of the first day of July in the CHAP rate period, as a Level I or

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Level II trauma center by the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) in accordance with the provisions of subsections (a)(1) through (a)(3) of this Section.

- 1) Level I Trauma Center Adjustment ~~(TCA)~~.
  - A) Criteria. Illinois hospitals that, on the first day of July in the CHAP rate period, are recognized as a Level I trauma center by the Illinois Department of Public Health shall receive the Level I trauma center adjustment.
  - B) Adjustment. Illinois hospitals meeting the criteria specified in subsection (a)(1)(A) of this Section shall receive an adjustment as follows:
    - i) Hospitals with Medicaid trauma admissions equal to or greater than the mean Medicaid trauma admissions, for all hospitals qualifying under subsection (a)(1)(A) of this Section, shall receive an adjustment of \$21,365.00 per Medicaid trauma admission in the CHAP base period.
    - ii) Hospitals with Medicaid trauma admissions less than the mean Medicaid trauma admissions, for all hospitals qualifying under subsection (a)(1)(A) of this Section, shall receive an adjustment of \$14,165.00 per Medicaid trauma admission in the CHAP base period.
- 2) Level II Rural Trauma Center Adjustment ~~(TCA)~~. Illinois rural hospitals, as defined in Section 148.25(g)(3), that, on the first day of July in the CHAP rate period, are recognized as a Level II trauma center by the Illinois Department of Public Health shall receive an adjustment of \$11,565.00 per Medicaid trauma admission in the CHAP base period.
- 3) Level II Urban Trauma Center Adjustment ~~(TCA)~~. Illinois urban hospitals, as described in Section 148.25(g)(4), that, on the first day of July in the CHAP rate period, are recognized as Level II trauma centers by the Illinois Department of Public Health shall receive an adjustment of \$11,565.00 per Medicaid trauma admission in the CHAP base period, provided that such hospital meets the criteria described below:
  - A) The hospital is located in a county with no Level I trauma center; and
  - B) The hospital is located in a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) (42 CFR 5), as of the first day of July in the CHAP rate period, and has a Medicaid trauma admission percentage at or above the mean of the individual facility values determined in subsection (a)(3) of this Section; or the hospital is not located in an HPSA ~~(42 CFR 5)~~ and has a Medicaid trauma admission

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percentage that is at least the mean plus one standard deviation of the individual facility values determined in subsection (a)(3) of this Section.

- b) Rehabilitation Hospital Adjustment (RHA)  
Illinois hospitals that, on the first day of July in the CHAP rate period, qualify as rehabilitation hospitals, as defined in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.50(c)(2), and that are accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), shall receive a rehabilitation hospital adjustment in the CHAP rate period that consists of the following three components:
- 1) Treatment Component. All hospitals defined in subsection (b) of this Section shall receive ~~\$4,215.00~~ ~~\$3,886~~ per Medicaid Level I rehabilitation admission in the CHAP base period.
  - 2) Facility Component. All hospitals defined in subsection (b) of this Section shall receive a facility component that shall be based upon the number of Medicaid Level I rehabilitation admissions in the CHAP base period as follows:
    - A) Hospitals with fewer than 60 Medicaid Level I rehabilitation admissions in the CHAP base period shall receive a facility component of ~~\$229,360.00~~ ~~\$211,450~~ in the CHAP rate period.
    - B) Hospitals with 60 or more Medicaid Level I rehabilitation admissions in the CHAP base period shall receive a facility component of ~~\$527,528.00~~ ~~\$486,335~~ in the CHAP rate period.
  - 3) Health Professional Shortage Area Adjustment Component. Hospitals defined in subsection (b) of this Section that are located in an HPSA (~~42 CFR 5~~) on July 1, 1999, shall receive ~~\$276.00~~ ~~\$254~~ per Medicaid Level I rehabilitation inpatient day in the CHAP base period.
- c) Direct Hospital Adjustment (DHA) Criteria
- 1) Qualifying Criteria  
Hospitals may qualify for the DHA under this subsection c) under the following categories:
    - A) Except for hospitals operated by the University of Illinois, children's hospitals, psychiatric hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals and long term stay hospitals, all other hospitals located in Health Service Area (HSA) 6 that either:
      - i) were eligible for Direct Hospital Adjustments under the CHAP program as of July 1, 1999, and had a Medicaid inpatient utilization rate (MIUR) equal to or greater than the statewide mean in Illinois on July 1, 1999;
      - ii) were eligible under the Supplemental Critical Hospital Adjustment Payment (SCHAP) program as of July 1, 1999,

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- and had an MIUR equal to or greater than the statewide mean in Illinois on July 1, 1999; or
- iii) were county owned hospitals as defined in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 148.25(b)(1)(A), and had an MIUR equal to or greater than the statewide mean in Illinois on July 1, 1999.
- B) Illinois hospitals located outside of HSA 6 that had an MIUR greater than 60 percent on July 1, 1999, and an average length of stay less than ten days. The following hospitals are excluded from qualifying under this subsection (c)(1)(B): children's hospitals; psychiatric hospitals; rehabilitation hospitals; and long term stay hospitals.
- C) Children's hospitals, as defined under 89 Ill. Adm. Code Section 149.50(c)(3), on July 1, 1999.
- D) Illinois teaching hospitals, with more than 40 graduate medical education programs on July 1, 1999, not qualifying in subsection (c)(1)(A), (B), or (C) of this Section.
- E) Except for hospitals operated by the University of Illinois, children's hospitals, psychiatric hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals, long term stay hospitals and hospitals qualifying in subsection (c)(1)(A), (B), (C) or (D) of this Section, all other hospitals located in Illinois that had an MIUR equal to or greater than the mean plus one-half standard deviation on July 1, 1999, and provided more than 15,000 Total days.
- ~~F) Except for hospitals operated by the University of Illinois, children's hospitals, psychiatric hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals, long term stay hospitals and hospitals otherwise qualifying in subsection (c)(1)(A), (B), (C), (D) or (E) of this Section, all other hospitals that had an MIUR greater than 20.25 percent on July 1, 1999, and provided more than 20,000 Total days.~~
- ~~G) Except for hospitals operated by the University of Illinois, children's hospitals, psychiatric hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals, long term stay hospitals and hospitals otherwise qualifying in subsection (c)(1)(A), (B), (C), (D), (E) or (F) of this Section, all other hospitals that had an MIUR greater than 50 percent on July 1, 1999, and provided more than 10,000 Total days.~~
- ~~F)H) Except for hospitals operated by the University of Illinois, children's hospitals, psychiatric hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals, long term stay hospitals and hospitals otherwise qualifying in subsection (c)(1)(A), (B), (C), (D), or (E), ~~(F) or (G)~~ of this Section, all other hospitals that had an MIUR greater than 40~~

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percent on July 1, 1999, and provided more than 7,500 Total days and provided obstetrical care as of July 1, 2001.

- 2) DHA Rates
- A) For hospitals qualifying under subsection (c)(1)(A) of this Section, the DHA rates are as follows:
- i) Hospitals that have a Combined MIUR that is equal to or greater than the Statewide mean Combined MIUR, but less than one standard deviation above the Statewide mean Combined MIUR, will receive ~~\$69.00~~ ~~\$63~~-per day for hospitals that do not provide obstetrical care and ~~\$105.00~~ ~~\$97~~-per day for hospitals that do provide obstetrical care.
  - ii) Hospitals that have a Combined MIUR that is equal to or greater than one standard deviation above the Statewide mean Combined MIUR, but less than one and one-half standard deviation above the Statewide mean Combined MIUR, will receive ~~\$105.00~~ ~~\$97~~-per day for hospitals that do not provide obstetrical care and ~~\$142.00~~ ~~\$131~~-per day for hospitals that do provide obstetrical care.

- f) Critical Hospital Adjustment Limitations  
Hospitals that qualify for trauma center adjustments under subsection (a) of this Section shall not be eligible for the total trauma center adjustment if, during the CHAP rate period, the hospital is no longer recognized by the Illinois Department

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of Public Health as a Level I trauma center as required for the adjustment described in subsection (a)(1) of this Section, or a Level II trauma center as required for the adjustment described in subsection (a)(2) or (a)(3) of this Section. In these instances, the adjustments calculated shall be pro-rated, as applicable, based upon the date that such recognition ceased.

- 11) "RCHAP obstetrical care admissions" means Medicaid Obstetrical Care Admissions, as defined in subsection (g)(7) of this Section, with a Diagnosis Related Grouping (DRG) of 370 through 375, occurring in the CHAP base period.
- 12) "Total admissions" means total paid admissions contained in the Department's paid claims database, including obstetrical admissions multiplied by two and excluding Medicare crossover admissions, for dates of service occurring in State fiscal year 1998 and adjudicated through June 30, 1999.
- 13) "Total days" means total paid days contained in the Department's paid claims database, including obstetrical days multiplied by two and

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excluding Medicare crossover days, for dates of service occurring in State fiscal year 1998 and adjudicated through June 30, 1999.

- 14) "Total obstetrical days" means hospital inpatient days for dates of service occurring in State fiscal year 1998 and adjudicated through June 30, 1999, with an ICD-9-CM principal diagnosis code of 640.0 through 648.9 with a 5th digit of 1 or 2; 650; 651.0 through 659.9 with a 5th digit of 1, 2, 3, or 4; 660.0 through 669.9 with a 5th digit of 1, 2, 3, or 4; 670.0 through 676.9 with a 5th digit of 1 or 2; V27 through V27.9; V30 through V39.9; or any ICD-9-CM principal diagnosis code that is accompanied with a surgery procedure code between 72 and 75.99; and specifically excludes Medicare/Medicaid crossover claims.

- a) Inpatient Rate Reviews
- 1) Hospitals shall be notified of their inpatient rate for the rate year and shall have an opportunity to request a review of any rate for errors in calculation made by the Department. Such a request must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its rates. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
  - 2) Hospitals reimbursed in accordance with Sections 148.250 through 148.300 and 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149 with respect to per diem add-ons for capital may request that an adjustment be made to their base year costs to reflect significant changes in costs ~~that~~ which have been mandated in order to meet State, federal or local health and safety standards, and ~~that~~ which have occurred since the hospital's filing of the base year cost report. The allowable Medicare/Medicaid costs must be identified from the most recent audited cost report available. These costs must be significant, i.e., on a per unit basis, they must constitute one percent or more of the total allowable Medicaid/Medicare unit costs for the same time period. Appeals for base year cost adjustments must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its rates. Such request shall include a clear explanation of the cost change and documentation of

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the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.

- b) DSH Determination Reviews
- 1) Hospitals shall be notified of their qualification for DSH payment adjustments and shall have an opportunity to request a review of the DSH add-on for errors in calculation made by the Department. Such a request must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its disproportionate share qualification and add-on calculations. Such request shall include a clear explanation of the error and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
  - 2) DSH determination reviews shall be limited to the following:
    - A) DSH Determination Criteria. The criteria for DSH determination shall be in accordance with Section 148.120. Review shall be limited to verification that the Department utilized criteria in accordance with State regulations.
    - B) Medicaid Inpatient Utilization Rates. Medicaid inpatient utilization rates shall be calculated pursuant to Section 1923 of the Social Security Act and as defined in Section 148.120(k)(5). Review shall be limited to verification that Medicaid inpatient utilization rates were calculated in accordance with federal and State regulations.
    - C) Low Income Utilization Rates. Low Income utilization rates shall be calculated in accordance with Section 1923 of the Social Security Act and Section 148.120(a)(2) and (d). Review shall be limited to verification that low income utilization rates were calculated in accordance with federal and State regulations.
    - D) Federally Designated Health Manpower Shortage Areas (HMSAs). Illinois hospitals located in federally designated HMSAs shall be identified in accordance with 42 CFR 5~~;~~ (1989)~~;~~ and Section 148.120(a)(3) based upon the methodologies utilized by, and the most current information available to the Department from the federal Department of Health and Human Services as of June 30, 1992. Review shall be limited to hospitals in locations that have failed to obtain designation as federally designated HMSAs only when such a request for review is accompanied by documentation from the Department of Health and Human Services substantiating

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that the hospital was located in a federally designated HMSA as of June 30, 1992.

- E) Excess Beds. Excess bed information shall be determined in accordance with Public Act 86-268 (~~Code~~ Section 148.120(a)(3) and 77 Ill. Adm. Code 1100) based upon the methodologies utilized by, and the most current information available to, the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Board as of July 1, 1991. Reviews shall be limited to requests accompanied by documentation from the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Board substantiating that the information supplied to and utilized by the Department was incorrect.
  - F) Medicaid Obstetrical Inpatient Utilization Rates. Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rates shall be calculated in accordance with Section 148.120(a)(4), (k)(4), (k)(6) and (k)(7). Review shall be limited to verification that Medicaid obstetrical inpatient utilization rates were calculated in accordance with State regulations.
- c) Outlier Adjustment Reviews
- The Department shall make outlier adjustments to payment amounts in accordance with 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.105 or Section 148.130, whichever is applicable. Hospitals shall be notified of the specific information ~~that which~~ shall be utilized in the determination of those services qualified for an outlier adjustment and shall have an opportunity to request a review of such specific information for errors in calculation made by the Department. Such a request must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of the specific information ~~that which~~ shall be utilized in the determination of those services qualified for an outlier adjustment. Such request shall include a clear explanation of the error and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- d) Cost Report Reviews
- 1) Cost reports are required from:
    - A) All enrolled hospitals within the State of Illinois;
    - B) All out-of-state hospitals providing 100 inpatient days of service per hospital fiscal year, to persons covered by the Illinois Medical Assistance Program; and
    - C) All hospitals not located in Illinois that elect to be reimbursed under the methodology described in 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149 (the DRG PPS).

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- 2) The completed cost statement with a copy of the hospital's Medicare cost report and audited financial statement must be submitted annually within 90 days ~~after of~~ the close of the hospital's fiscal year. A one-time 30-day extension may be requested. Such a request for an extension shall be in writing and shall be received by the Department's Office of Health Finance prior to the end of the 90-day filing period. The Office of Health Finance shall audit the information shown on the Hospital Statement of Reimbursable Cost and Support Schedules. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- e) Trauma Center Adjustment Reviews
  - 1) The Department shall make trauma care adjustments in accordance with Section 148.290(c). Hospitals shall have the right to appeal the trauma center adjustment calculations if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department.
  - 2) Trauma level designation is obtained from the Illinois Department of Public Health as of the first day of July preceding the trauma center adjustment rate period. Review shall be limited to requests accompanied by documentation from the Illinois Department of Public Health, or the licensing agency in the state in which the hospital is located, substantiating that the information supplied to and utilized by the Department was incorrect.
  - 3) Appeals under this subsection (e) must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification for trauma center adjustments and payment amounts. Such a request shall include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request

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for review.

- f) **Medicaid High Volume Adjustment Reviews**  
The Department shall make Medicaid high volume adjustments in accordance with Section 148.290(d). Review shall be limited to verification that the Medicaid inpatient days were calculated in accordance with State regulations. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification for Medicaid high volume adjustments and payment amounts. Such a request shall include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- g) **Sole Community Hospital Designation Reviews**  
The Department shall make sole community hospital designations in accordance with 89 Ill. Adm. Code 149.125(b). Hospitals shall have the right to appeal the designation if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the determination. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after notification of the designation. Such a request shall include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation of the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review no later than 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- h) **Geographic Designation Reviews**
- 1) The Department shall make rural hospital designations in accordance with Section 148.25(g)(3). Hospitals shall have the right to appeal the designation if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the determination. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notification of the designation. Such a request shall include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation of the desired correction.   - 2) The Department shall make urban hospital designations in accordance with Section 148.25(g)(4). Hospitals shall have the right to appeal the designation if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the determination. Review shall be limited to verification that Medicaid inpatient utilization rates were calculated in accordance with federal and State regulations.
- E) Graduate Medical Education Programs. Graduate Medical Education program information shall be obtained from the most recently published report of the American Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education, the American Osteopathic Association Division of Post-doctoral Training, or the American Dental Association Joint Commission on Dental Accreditation as of the last day of June preceding the CHAP rate period. Review shall be limited to requests accompanied by documentation from the above, substantiating that the information supplied to and utilized by the Department was incorrect.
- j) Tertiary Care Adjustment Payment Reviews. The Department shall make Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments in accordance with Section 148.296. Hospitals shall be notified in writing of the results of the Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments determination and calculation, and shall have the right to appeal the Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments calculation or their ineligibility for Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification for Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments and payment adjustment amounts, or a letter of notification that the hospital does not qualify for Tertiary Care Adjustment Payments. Such a request must include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation that supports the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- k) Pediatric Outpatient Adjustment Payments. The Department shall make Pediatric Outpatient Adjustment payments in accordance with Section 148.297. Hospitals shall be notified in writing of the results of the determination and calculation, and shall have the right to appeal the calculation or their ineligibility for payments under Section 148.297 if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the

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calculation by the Department. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification under Section 148.297 and payment adjustment amounts, or a letter of notification that the hospital does not qualify for such payments. Such a request must include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation that supports the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.

- l) Pediatric Inpatient Adjustment Payments. The Department shall make Pediatric Inpatient Adjustment payments in accordance with Section 148.298. Hospitals shall be notified in writing of the results of the determination and calculation, and shall have the right to appeal the calculation or their ineligibility for payments under Section 148.298 if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification under Section 148.298 and payment adjustment amounts, or a letter of notification that the hospital does not qualify for such payments. Such a request must include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation that supports the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- m) Safety Net Adjustment Payment Reviews. The Department shall make Safety Net Adjustment Payments in accordance with Section 148.126. Hospitals shall be notified in writing of the results of the Safety Net Adjustment Payment determination and calculation and shall have the right to appeal the Safety Net Adjustment Payment calculation or their ineligibility for Safety Net Adjustment Payments if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification for Safety Net Adjustment Payments and payment adjustment amounts, or a letter of notification that the hospital does not qualify for Safety Net Adjustment Payments. Such a request must include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation that supports the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review with 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- n) Psychiatric Adjustment Payment. The Department shall make Psychiatric Adjustment Payments in accordance with Section 148.105. Hospitals shall be notified in writing of the results of the Psychiatric Adjustment Payments determination and calculation, and shall have a right to appeal the Psychiatric

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Adjustment Payments calculation or their ineligibility for Psychiatric Adjustment Payments if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification for Psychiatric Adjustment Payments and payment adjustment amounts, or a letter of notification that the hospital does not qualify for Psychiatric Adjustment Payments. Such a request must include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation that supports the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.

- o) Rural Adjustment Payment. The Department shall make Rural Adjustment Payments in accordance with Section 148.115.
- 1) Hospitals shall be notified in writing of the results of the Rural Adjustment Payments determination and calculation, and shall have a right to appeal the Rural Adjustment Payments calculation or their ineligibility for Rural Adjustment Payments if it is believed that a technical error has been made in the calculation by the Department.
  - 2) The designation of Critical Access Provider or Necessary Provider, which are qualifying criteria for Rural Adjustment Payments (see Section 148.115(a)), is obtained from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) as of the first day of July proceeding the Rural Adjustment Payment rate period. Review shall be limited to requests accompanied by documentation from IDPH, substantiating that the information supplied to and utilized by the Department was incorrect.
  - 3) The appeal must be submitted in writing to the Department and must be received or post marked within 30 days after the date of the Department's notice to the hospital of its qualification for Rural Adjustment Payments and payment adjustment amounts, or a letter of notification that the hospital does not qualify for Rural Adjustment Payments. Such a request must include a clear explanation of the reason for the appeal and documentation that supports the desired correction. The Department shall notify the hospital of the results of the review within 30 days after receipt of the hospital's request for review.
- p)m) For purposes of this Section, the term "post marked" means the date of processing by the United States Post Office or any independent carrier service.
- q)n) The review procedures provided for in this Section may not be used to submit any new or corrected information that was required to be submitted by a specific date in order to qualify for a payment or payment adjustment. In addition, only information that was submitted expressly for the purpose of qualifying for the

Departing Tokyo October 24, 1945, Hanna returned to Eniwetok and then sailed to Guam, where she took up duty as an air-sea rescue and weather reporting ship. She continued this important task until her return to the States, where she decommissioned at San Diego May 31, 1946, and joined the Pacific Reserve Fleet; and

WHEREAS, shipmates who served on the USS Hanna while commissioned during World War II have gathered in Springfield, Illinois, to celebrate their 20th official reunion October 3-6, 2002. This is the third such reunion held in our great State, having also celebrated the seventh reunion in 1989 in Springfield and the 18th reunion in 2000 in Delavan;
