Jesse White Announces New Driver Services Facility Location in Lawrenceville
Facility expected to open Oct. 1

Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White announced today that the new Driver Services facility in Lawrenceville, located at 1305 State St., is expected to be open for business on Thursday, Oct. 1. The new facility is over 1,600 square feet, more than 300 square feet larger than the previous facility. The previous facility, located at 406 N. 15th St., will close after business on Saturday, Sept. 19.

“The new facility in Lawrenceville is conveniently located less than a mile from the previous facility and provides easy access and ample parking compared to the previous location,” said White. “It was my priority to find a new location in Lawrenceville to serve the surrounding community.”

White’s office has been working with the landlord who, as part of the 10-year lease agreement, is in charge of making necessary modifications to the building. These modifications — standard when opening a Driver Services facility at a new site — are designed to maximize the facility’s traffic flow and efficiency.

In addition, White is reminding drivers age 75 and older with valid driver’s licenses that their driver’s license expiration date has been extended by one year; the new expiration date is their birthday in 2021.

White continues to urge the public to consider using online services when possible. Customers may go to www.cyberdriveillinois.com to take advantage of online services—such as renewing license plate stickers—from the comfort of their own home. People who conduct online transactions will avoid waiting in line at a facility.

Prior to the new Lawrenceville facility opening on Oct. 1, customers are encouraged to visit the nearest Driver Services facilities, including:

- Olney Driver Services facility at 1302 W. West St., R.R. 1
- Robinson Driver Services facility at 1321 E. Main
- Mt. Carmel Driver Services facility at 219 W. Second St.

For customers who must visit a facility, face masks are required. In addition, customers are asked to be patient due to heavy volume and to be prepared to wait outside in various types of weather. This is due to social distancing, which limits the number of people inside a facility at one time.
